3. REPORT DETAIL

### 3.1 Political Groups

3.1.1 In accordance with Regulation 8 of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990, the under-mentioned

### 3.2 Annual Review of the Political Balance of the Council and Appointment and Composition of Committees

3.2.1 There have been no changes to political party membership since the previous review of political balance in May 2010 and so the political balance of the Council is:

3.2.2 Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 (Duty to Allocate Seats to Political Groups) sets out the requirements as to political proportionality on Council bodies and requires the Council, in allocating seats on committees and sub-committees of the Council to political groups, to give effect, so far as practicable, to the following rules:
(i) that not all seats on the committee/sub-committee are allocated to the same political group;
(ii) that the political group having a majority of seats on the Council should have a majority on each committee and sub-committee;
(iii) that, subject to (i) and (ii) above, the number of seats on the Council's committees and sub-committees allocated to each political group, bears the same proportion to the total number of such committee/sub-committee seats as the number of members of that group bears to the membership of the full Council, and
(iv) that, subject to (i) to (iii) above, seats will be allocated on each committee and sub-committee in the same ratio as exists on the full Council.
3.2.3 The Council's overriding duty to comply with (i) and (ii) above takes precedence over achieving a mathematically balanced distribution of Committee seats as described in (iii) and (iv).

*4 seats are allocated to statutory Education Voting Co-Optees on Scrutiny, the percentage allocation excludes these four voting seats
3.2.4 In accordance with Article 4.01(f) of the Constitution, the Council is required to decide on the composition of Committees and make appointments to them. It is therefore proposed that Council appoint the following Committees and agree their composition:

\# The Audit Advisory Committee also appoints an Independent, non-voting co-opted Member to serve on that Committee.
3.2.5 Should the Council be minded to agree the allocation and composition of Committees as detailed above, Members are asked to agree a number of small consequential amendments to Part 3 of the Constitution, which details the size of each Committee.
3.2.6 The Ethics Committee is separately constituted. Following the abolition of the Standards Committee by the Localism Act 2011 and the political balance requirements of the 1989 Act do not apply. However the Constitution provides that both political groups must be represented. The Ethics Committee is constituted of five Councillors and three Non Elected Independent persons.
3.2.7 Sub-Committees of the Licensing Committee are separately constituted under the Licensing Act 2003. There is no statutory requirement for political balance or for it to be included in the Council's political balance calculations, but it is the practice of the authority to ensure that, as far as reasonably practicable, such Sub-Committees are constituted in accordance with the Council's scheme of proportionality.
3.2.8 The Health \& Well-Being Board is separately constituted under the Health and Social Care Act 2012. Regulations made under the Health and Social Act 2012 provide that Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 (Duty to Allocate Seats to Political Groups) need not apply to the composition of this Board.

## 4. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The recommendations contained within this report are compliant with the Council's duties under the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990, the Local Government Act 2000, the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Constitution.
