#### REPORT FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SCRUTINY AND STRATEGIC OVERVIEW COMMITTEE

#### 1. Recent Scrutiny Committee Meetings

- 1.1 This report provides an account of Scrutiny activity carried out by the following committees between 15 October and 1 December 2013:
  - The Scrutiny and Strategic Overview Committee
  - The Children and Young People Scrutiny Sub-Committee
  - The Health, Social and Care and Housing Scrutiny Sub-Committee

#### 2 Scrutiny and Strategic Overview Committee

At the meeting of the Scrutiny and Strategic Overview Committee on 5 November 2013, members considered items relating to:

- Flood Risk Prevention
- District Centres
- 2.1 Members heard from officers about measures taken on **Flood Risk Prevention** in response to the Flood Water Management Act 2010 which placed new responsibilities on the council. Representatives of the Environment Agency and the community were also in attendance. Members commended the development and environment department for the implementation of the gully and soakaway clearing programme over the past two years. It also endorsed the other work being undertaken by the department in managing flood risk from surface water, groundwater and ordinary watercourses in the Borough and offered its support for future funding bids to carry out flood risk prevention works.
- 2.2 Members heard that there are a number of ways of measuring business vitality in **District Centres** and that one form of regeneration is through businesses working together, possibly in designated Business Improvement Districts. Members were concerned about issues relating to the number of vacant premises in some areas, footfall, access, trade waste, the quality and variety of businesses located in District Centres and parking. Members remarked how the figures for the rates of vacant premises were in unexpected areas. Members asked officers to consider including information relating to vacant premises in reports to the planning committee and to

extend the project to analyse parking use and charges in South End to other areas in the future if it proves to have a beneficial effect on local business vitality.

#### 3 Children and Young People Scrutiny Sub-Committee

- 3.1 At the meeting of the Sub Committee on 15 October 2013, members considered the topic of **Youth Employability** particularly with regard to ensuring that young people are prepared to take advantage of the employment opportunities coming to the Borough. A number of council officers and stakeholders were present including members of the Youth Council who were able to provide a useful perspective on the issues raised.
- 3.2 The committee also received information about:
  - Apprenticeships
  - The need for young people to develop both functional skills and 'soft' skills
  - The need for higher educational achievement among young people
  - The importance of careers advice and the role of parents helping young people identify a career path
- 3.3 Members of the Sub-Committee asked that a follow-up item on school exam results be brought to the meeting on 11 February 2014. In addition they asked that Youth Employability from the perspective of businesses be added to the 2014-15 work programme with representatives from local businesses being invited to attend the relevant meeting.

#### 4. Health, Social Care and Housing Scrutiny Sub-Committee

- 4.1 At its meeting on 21 October 2013 and following a referral from the Corporate Parenting Panel, the Sub-Committee reviewed and commented on progress made in the light of an OFSTED inspection of the **Child & Adolescent Health Service** (CAMHs) in May 2012. Members were informed that significant progress had been made to address the areas of concern raised by OFSTED and that an action plan had been put in place. Officers were able to demonstrate that the plan included named officers and specific end times but Sub-Committee members remained sceptical. The Sub Committee was broadly satisfied with the action taken but would be asking for a followup report at a future meeting.
- 4.2 Also at the meeting on 21 October, the **Croydon Clinical Commissioning Group** (CCG) provided an update on the first 6-months of the organisation, progress made to date and its plans to manage a £50m funding gap whilst continuing to improve and maintain quality primary and secondary care. The CCG also provided its response to the recommendations made by the South West London **NHS Finance** Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee (JHOSC) which was accepted by the Committee.
- 4.3 At its meeting on 19 November 2013 the Sub-Committee considered information from representatives from NHS England, Public Health England and Croydon council on the current role and responsibilities of organisations

in improving coverage of Childhood Immunisations in London, NHS England's plans to improve reported rates of childhood immunisation, the national MMR catch-up campaign, local challenges and initiatives and NHS England's Plan for London. These plans included new technology (nasal sprays), alternative providers (Pharmacists) and a practice focus. Members were concerned at the low reported rates of immunization for Croydon. The NHS Bodies did not appear as concerned and felt that the absence of an epidemic in Croydon shows that herd immunity has not been compromised. However there was acceptance that reporting systems and the consistent lack of reporting by 19 GP practices meant that the data was not reliable. Members concluded that the current reporting system could not give confidence in the data, received a commitment from NHS England that the annual birthday card/Celebration card ("celebrate to protect") that acts as a reminder to parents that their child is due to be immunised would be continue to be funded beyond 2014 and agreed to review the process of the 6 month plan at their meeting on 11 March 2014.

- 4.4 Also at its meeting on 19 November, the Sub-Committee received the Croydon Adult Safeguarding annual report and information about performance relating to the protection of vulnerable people. The work reported includes turning around the life chances of some of the most vulnerable people in the borough, creating a safer and stronger community, improving health and well-being, tackling inequality, ensuring respect for people as they age and reducing the impact of long term conditions and disability. Members felt that the report was informative and well presented. Officers informed Members that their recommendation last year had been incorporated within the report round the recording of data. Members suggesting recording of outcomes to strengthen data recording. This was noted and would be included in the annual report next year. Deprivation of liberty had been a past committee concern, it was reported that the instances of reporting were in decline, this could be attributed to a lack of understanding – under reporting, or a training need. 868 represents the general safeguarding instances reported this year of this number a third were deemed substantive.
- 4.5 On 19 November, the Sub-Committee received responses to the recommendations following the review of **NHS Croydon finances** by the South West London Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee (JHOSC). Members heard that the Secretary of State had responded to the report and that most of the proposals in recommendations 9.1 and 9.2 would be included in the new DoH guidance on Local Government scrutiny functions to ensure that NHS organisations are aware of their duties and responsibilities. Members felt that the guidance clarification was a good result for the JHOSC, "the best we could expect" and that it recognised that the recommendations had been sensible. The general consensus was that chief executives should be held to account after they have left the organisation.
- 4.6 The Sub-Committee heard that the South West London JHOSC on **Better Services Better Value** (BSBV) was due to meet on 11 November although this meeting was subsequently postponed following the announcement by

Surrey Downs to leave the JHOSC and oppose the BSBV programme. BSBV officers are in the process of amending the option appraisal by last December and to the back to the public consultation stage in January 2014.
