I am pleased to say, Croydon is receiving more and more recognition for being a vibrant, excellent borough and a real economic driving force in London. I recently attended the **Croydon Business Excellence Awards** and was delighted to see what a fantastic buzz was being generated about our borough. The passion and energy in the venue was a real show of how far Croydon has come since May 2014. The BoxPark launch at the end of October will only continue to add to the offer of our borough and is sure to be a massive win for our town.

According to the latest research, **Croydon has the UK's fastest growing economy** as it increasingly becomes a leading business hub for technology companies. Croydon topped the list of 173 areas as the fastest growing UK region and has been dubbed 'London's third city' and the 'Silicon Valley of South London'. We are now home to over 1000 digital, creative, and technology companies. And East Croydon railway station is now one of the UK's busiest stations with over 22 million passengers in the last year.

As the largest population by borough, Croydon is, as we know, an incredibly diverse, multi-cultural hub and I was really proud to attend the fantastic launch of **Black History Month** at the beginning of October, the specific theme this year being Our Young Achievers. It served as brilliant introduction to all the events that will be taking place throughout October including elements of dance, film, talks and music all promoted and supported by our Council.
