1. RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 The Committee is asked to note as per Regulation 3 of the Tenders and Contracts Regulations the exceptions approved by the Director of Strategy, Communities and Commissioning since the last meeting of the Committee.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2.1 This is a standard report presented to General Purposes & Audit Committee (GPAC) notifying them of any exceptions agreed to the Tenders and Contracts Regulations by the Director of Strategy, Communities and Commissioning.

3. DETAIL

- 3.1 Since the last meeting of GPAC there have been two exceptions approved under Regulation 3 both in relation to the direct award of contracts as follows:

Integrated Sexual Health Service Contract Award (Cabinet Minute Ref A12/15)

- 3.2 The Croydon Sexual Health Strategy 2011/16 identified a need to integrate existing service provision, improve access and increase the uptake of sexual health services through targeting groups at higher risk of sexual ill health to improve outcomes and cost effectiveness. As part of the procurement strategy a direct award of contract to the existing provider Croydon University Hospital for period of one year (1st April 2015 to 31st March 2016) was considered necessary to provide sufficient time to redesign and commission a new service in April 2016. .
- 3.3 The decision to make the award was taken by the Cabinet Member for People and Communities in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Finance and Treasury. Prior to the decision being made the intention to award was reported to Cabinet in January 2015 [London Borough of Croydon - Integrated Sexual health Services Contract Award](#). The direct award also delivers cost savings of £260k for 2015/16.

Connected Croydon- Old Town (Church Street) Public Realm Works (Cabinet Minute Ref A26/15)

- 3.4 To ensure the Council maximised the opportunity for the Easter Tram shutdown of 16 days in delivering the Church Street programme of Public Realm Works an exception to the Tenders and Contracts Regulations was approved to enable a direct award under the Council's Highways Framework to EM Highways Limited.
- 3.5 Running a competitive tender would not have enabled the construction works to start in time to make use of the Easter shutdown. The contractor having the possession of the whole road would improve efficiency and reduce the duration of construction works by five weeks. This will enable Church Street to be clear of major roadworks by Christmas 2015. In addition the direct award enabled the Council to take advantage of the base rates quoted by the EM Highways Limited which were provided in 2011 when the market was buyer constrained (highly competitive rather than supplier constrained as the market is currently). The index linked uplift from 2011 rates within the contract is 4.67% which is below construction inflation which was 6% for 2013/14.
- 3.6 The decision to make this award was taken the Cabinet Member for Economic development in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Finance and Treasury. Prior to the decision being made the intention to award was reported to Cabinet in February 2015 [London Borough of Croydon -Old Town \(Church Street\)](#)
