Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

This licence is granted subject to the terms of the Licensing Act 2003

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person* shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
 7. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- * Responsible person is defined in the Licensing Act 2003 as 'the holder of a premises licence, designated premises supervisor, a person aged 18 or over who is authorised to allow the sale or supply of alcohol by an under 18 or a member or officer of a club present on the club premises who can oversee the supply of alcohol'.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

The premises licence holder shall –

1. (i) Install and maintain a CCTV system to the reasonable requirements of the Metropolitan Police, covering the entrances, exits, internal and external areas of the premises. Recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days and CCTV images delivered to Police or Council Officers, in DVD form on request.
(ii) Ensure a member of staff who is proficient in the use of the CCTV system shall be on duty at all times that alcohol is on sale.
(iii) Ensure a head and shoulders image shall be captured of all persons entering the venue to 'identification' standard.
2. Ensure that non-alcoholic drinks are available for retail sale at all times when the sale of alcohol is authorised at the premises by the Premises Licence.
3. Ensure that all staff are given regular training, supervised by the DPS, in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 and conflict management. Training records will be kept at the premises and refresher training will be given to all staff at least every six months.
4. Ensure the premises operates a Challenge 25 policy whereby anyone attempting to purchase alcohol who looks under 25 years of age shall be requested to show identification proving they are over 18 years of age.

Having received this application accompanied by the letter of support from Steve Reed MP, I was able to meet with the applicant at the premises on 3rd September 2014.

During this conversation it became apparent that the applicant did not know much about the licensing objectives and shockingly claimed to have never seen the premises licence.

When I pressed him on this he stated that he had only ever seen a summary. I asked him if he knew what time he was authorised to carry out licensable activities at the premises and he told me 11.30pm and 12 midnight at the weekend. This is not the case.

The premises are licensed as follows

Alcohol:-

Monday to Saturday 1000hrs to 2300hrs

Sunday 1200hrs to 2230hrs

Regulated Entertainment:-

Monday to Saturday 1000hrss to 2330hrs

Sunday 1200hrs to 2300hrs

The premises are unlicensed for late Night Refreshment. The applicant has been operating at the premises since the 1st May 2014.

During this same visit I discovered that the applicant was in breach of condition 3. There were no staff training records available and the applicant had no concept of what they were, claiming that a council official would be sending him some.

Furthermore it transpired that the applicant had made significant alterations to the layout of the premises without notifying either the police or local authority. This is simply not allowed.

The applicant was informed that police would be objecting to the variation based on the findings of that visit and the lack of confidence in the applicant's ability to comply with the existing conditions of the premises licence let alone any new ones, and his lack of understanding and support for the licensing objectives.

Police returned to the premises later that day to issue it with a closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police act 2001. The applicant was not at the premises however a kitchen assistant/barman who the applicant had earlier identified to me as a member of staff trained to use the CCTV as required in condition 1(ii) of the premises licence was present.

This male gave me his name address and date of birth. I asked him what his immigration status was and he told me he was on a student visa with entitlement to work 20hrs per week.

When I checked this out with the immigration service it turned out to be untrue. The male had been granted leave to remain in 2013 but had NO entitlement to seek employment.

Guidance under the Licensing act 2003 suggests that certain offences should be treated **particularly** seriously. This includes

'Knowingly employing a person who is unlawfully in the UK or cannot lawfully be employed as a result of a condition on a person's leave to enter or remain'.

Under this guidance either knowingly or failing to take sufficient steps to establish a persons entitlement to work in this country cause the Metropolitan Police serious concern.

Conclusion

From the outset this application has been shoddy. Times of activity have been over written and on first inspection are unclear. The steps listed to be taken to support the licensing objectives lack any real substance and some even directly contradict police findings at the premises.

The applicant has made no mention of any steps he intends to take in relation to late night activities in the basement.

He is not compliant with the current conditions of the premises licence.

He states he has never seen the premises licence, yet writes on this application that staff training is in place.

He has made significant structural alterations to the premises without authority.

In my opinion he has failed to demonstrate that he has taken ANY reasonable steps to a) establish what the premises licence authorises him to do or what the conditions are b) establish if members of staff are allowed to work in this country.

Having been fully appraised of events at the premises it is my understanding that the letter of support from the local MP will be withdrawn.

The applicant has failed to demonstrate any understanding of the licensing objectives. His almost negligent attitude to rules and regulations governing licensable activity is a major cause for concern. The Metropolitan Police in light of new evidence are giving consideration to a review of the premises licence based on the information obtained from the recent visit.

This premise's falls on the London road corridor which is designated as a Cumulative Impact Zone. The applicant has indicated that he requires off-sales. It is the opinion of the Metropolitan Police that this application would therefore have a negative cumulative impact on the local area and that the application should be refused.

On Wednesday 3rd September 2014 I was on duty in plain clothes performing my role as borough licensing officer. At 1100hrs I attended Dosti Restaurant & Bar, 774 London Road, Thornton Heath. There I met with the owner Mr Dowlet who had applied for a variation of the premises licence at the venue. During that visit I established that Mr Dowlet was in breach of condition number 3 of the premises licence which refers to staff training in relation to the licensing act 2003 and dealing with conflict. There were no staff training records.

Later that day I returned to the venue with PC 459ZD ROSE to issue the premises with a closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police act 2001, having established that alcohol had been sold that day.

I asked this male what his immigration status was, he told me that he was in the UK on a student visa studying hospitality and that he was entitled to work 20hrs per week. I contacted the immigration service to confirm these details and was told that the male was granted leave to remain in February 2013 but had no entitlement to seek employment. I was asked to relay to the male that he should desist from any employment with immediate effect and that his records would be updated, this I did.

The male had already been served with the closure notice and was in control of the premises whilst Mr Dowlet collected his children. *D Rhodes 19420*

Explanatory Notes

A Police Officer, or an authorised officer from the Local authority, has decided to issue this closure notice under the terms of section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 ("the 2001 Act").

Section 19 of the 2001 Act – Closure Notices

Where a Police Officer, or an authorised officer from the local authority, is satisfied that any premises are being, or within the last 24 hours have been used for the unlicensed sale of alcohol, including being in breach of its licence conditions, he may serve under subsection (3) a notice in respect of the premises.

Section 20 of the 2001 Act – Closure Orders

Your attention is drawn to section 20 of the 2001 Act. This provides that the police, or as the case may be local authority, can take action against the said premises by applying to a justice of the peace at the local magistrates' court for a closure order if the unlicensed sale of alcohol (as alleged in this closure notice) is continuing, or there is reasonable likelihood that the premises will be so used in the future. The application for a closure order must be so made not less than 7 days, and not more than 6 months, after the date on which this closure notice was served.

After an application for a closure notice is made, the justice of the peace may issue a summons requiring the applicant, and the person or persons on whom the closure notice was served, to attend a hearing at the court on a specified date and time. At the hearing the court will consider the applicant's complaint against the said premises and decide whether a closure order should or should not be made. In accordance with the Magistrates' Courts Act 1980, and under the law of human rights, you are entitled to be legally represented at the hearing and to make representations to the court before any such decision is taken.

Appeals – Section 24 of the 2001 Act

An appeal against a decision by the Magistrates' Court to grant a closure order, or a decision to refuse an application for closure, can be made by an affected person to the Crown Court within 21 days.

Enforcement Powers and offences – Section 25 of the 2001 Act

It is an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse, to permit a premises to be open in contravention of a closure order made by the magistrates' court. Any person found guilty of such an offence will be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or both.

It is also an offence for a person who, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any terms of a closure order made by the court, or does an act which contravenes those other terms. Any person convicted of this offence is liable to a fine not exceeding £5,000, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or both.

Police Officers and authorised officers from the local authority have the power to enter the said premises at "any reasonable time", and do anything necessary to secure compliance with the closure order (for example, to board up the premises). However, when exercising this power, the constable or the officer must produce evidence of his authority to enter and also his identity before entering the premises, if asked to do so by the owner (or occupier or the person in charge of the premises).

It is an offence for a person to intentionally obstruct police officers or authorised local authority officers from exercising these powers. Any person convicted of obstructing a police officer is liable to a fine not exceeding £5,000, or to one month's imprisonment, or to both. Any person convicted of obstructing an authorised local authority officer is liable to a fine not exceeding £5,000.

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

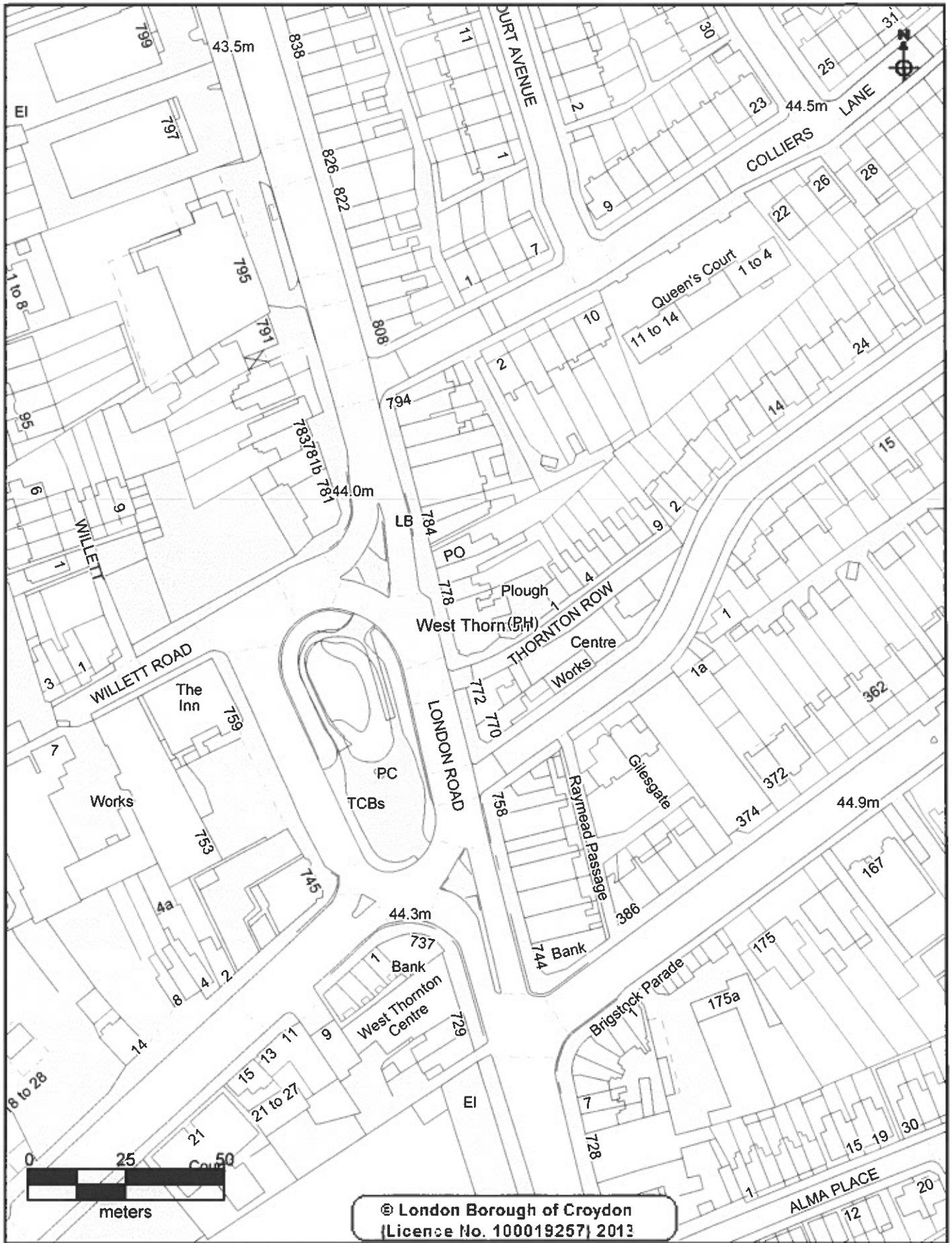

On Tuesday 2 nd September 2014 I was on duty in plain clothes working at Croydon Police Station. I attempted to contact the applicant of a Premises Licence variation relating to the Dosti Restaurant and Bar, 744 London Road, Thornton Heath, CR7 6JB. I phoned and received no reply I left an ansa phone message asking the applicant to contact me regarding this matter. The applicant is Mr Rajack DOWLET. I attended the premises later that day at 1145 hours. On the premises were 2 staff, I spoke to Mr [redacted] who told me he was a family member and was looking after the premises while the Owner / Applicant was away. He had no knowledge of the application and was unable to assist with questions and matters in relation to the application. He went on to say the applicant was returning from abroad tomorrow. I stressed that he needed to contact my office as a matter of urgency the next day as soon as he was able. This he did and PC Rhodes agreed to meet at the premises later that day which he did.

On Wednesday 3rd September 2014 I was on duty in plain clothes in company with PC 194 ZD Rhodes. We attended the venue. With a view to serving a Closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act, on arrival I spoke to Mr [redacted] who was behind the bar. I asked if the premises were operating and if they had sold alcohol today? Mr [redacted] stated that they had been quite but had served food and alcohol to customers earlier today. PC Rhodes took details from Mr [redacted] and moved away from my location to carry out checks whilst I spoke to Mr [redacted] and completed and served the Section 19 notice. He understood the notice and signed to agree its service at 1510 hours. PC Rhodes returned and stated in the presence of Mr [redacted] that his status in the UK was as a student and he was not allowed to work. He accepted this and stated that he had lied when telling us he was allowed to work 20 hours per week. PC Rhodes told Mr [redacted] that he must stop work immediately and not work at any time in the future under his visa restrictions.
