On the 2nd of March 2016 I submitted an application for the review of a premises licence of the Dice Bar, High Street Croydon. After an application has been made there is often a period of time where a premises would do its utmost to maintain an incident free period. This statement refers to several incidents which have occurred since the 2nd of March 2016.

Saturday 19th March 2016

At 2346 a white female is carried out of the Dice Bar as she is unable to walk unaided due to her intoxicated state, she is in the company of three of her friends and three door supervisors the female is placed on a black bench the door staff then return to the premises leaving the female in the company of her friends.

At 2349 there is a disturbance within the fenced off area outside the Dice Bar where a male wearing a white shirt is dragged out of the fenced area and forced onto the floor where he is restrained on the floor the male continually struggles with the door staff a second male is restrained by three door supervisors and although he continues to struggle he is not placed on the floor. As officers arrive they handcuff both males the two door staff restraining the male on the floor immediately get up and return to the bar. A female officer then discusses with one of the door supervisors what has happened and as a result both males have the handcuffs removed in order to give them dispersal notices to leave the town centre. Shortly after the male in the white shirt then starts to walk towards the bar and is stopped by police. The male becomes aggressive again and as a result of his behavior he is then arrested and requires several officers to detain him on the floor.

At 0015 am the intoxicated female carried out at 2346 is still on the bench and at this time is aided by Inspector Roche who makes reference to her level of intoxication in his statement.

At 0221am there is a male stood outside the entrance to the venue the barriers area all pulled together and he can be seen in conversation with a door supervisor. He is wearing a brown jacket with dark trousers and carrying a brown shoulder bag. He then walks to the edge of the fencing where he stops at the corner and begins to look through the gap between the fencing. He then walks towards the building line looks over the fencing again he then pulls the fencing back walks around the edge and climbs over the lower fencing inside and the enters the venue through the door to the smoking area, he is not searched and does not have his ID scanned or is he challenged.

At 0227 am there are two males at the entrance they are leaning across the roped area over the barrier fencing and interacting with customers in the smoking area. They are leaning across sufficiently to shake hands and touch the person they are talking to. The male wearing a hooded top under his jacket the indicates to a male inside the fenced area to walk over to the side of the outer fencing where the male in the black jacket over a hooded top looks through the fencing then raises both hands over the fencing which is tall metallic fencing about 6 feet tall he then hands something to a male inside the smoking area.

Dice Bar vulnerable persons Policy

On the 27th of March 2016

At 0307 am There is a male wearing a blue short sleeved shirt who appears from his demeanour and the way that he shuffles through the enclosed area of the Dice Bar to be heavily intoxicated he is ushered out by a door supervisor and then stands in the entrance not moving and appears unsteady on his feet. He remains there for a further ten minutes.

At 0317am the male in the blue shirt is still stood in the entrance when a girl in a black coat and brown bag is walked out of the premises with her arm around the shoulder of a female door supervisor supporting her as she is unable to walk unaided, they are accompanied by a male door supervisor. As they exit the main door the male in the blue short sleeve shirt then steps forward towards the girl and the door supervisors prevent him from getting near the female and he then follows them for a short distance and having been prevented from getting near the female stops and then walks back to his original position outside the entrance. He then walks over to the bench where he is then left in care of the female. The female door supervisor obtains a bottle of water and gives it to the female and then leaves the intoxicated male caring for the female.

At 0356 am A female exits the venue and immediately falls onto the floor where her friend manages to catch her initially before she slides to the floor. She is then lifted back onto her feet by one of the door supervisors and the females friend when she is then picked up and carried by the door supervisor to the bench in the High Street where she is left in the company of her friends. Officers have seen her leave the premises and sit with her friends and they have then discovered the female lying on the floor outside a retail shop where she was unresponsive but breathing. The ambulance service is requested but she refuses treatment the officers state that she was clearly very drunk. She makes an allegation of assault from inside the Dice Bar and that she has had her phone and her bag stolen the phone is found on her person, but she continues to allege that her bag has been stolen. Her behaviour deteriorates until she is finally arrested for being drunk and disorderly during this period she assaults two police officers.

The above incidents again demonstrate that the licensing objectives are not being promoted and that members of the public are at risk with little or no after care when people are ejected or removed from the premises because of their state of intoxication. We have worked over a long period of time in relation to trying to support this venue in reducing the levels of crime and disorder but incidents have occurred repeatedly with officers having to face violence and injury due to behaviour of the customers from this venue.

I am a Uniformed Police Inspector currently based on Croydon Borough. I have been an Inspector since September 2006 and have been based at Croydon since February 2012. I am currently responsible for the Town Centre and Central Neighbourhood Policing Teams. Part of my role is responsibility for the Policing of the Night Time Economy. I am also responsible for Operational Deployment of Police Resources in Fairfield Ward to reduce Violence with Injury Offences, Non Domestic Assaults as part of Op Equinox. Op Equinox is the Metropolitan Police Operation to reduce these offences, and put in place a long term problem solving process to ensure continued reduction. This Operation commenced in Oct 2014. Fairfield Ward has the 3rd highest number of Violence with Injury Offences within the Metropolitan Policing Area.

On Friday 19th March 2016, I was on duty in full uniform on foot patrol in Croydon Town Centre as part of Op Govern. Op Govern is a local Policing Operation to Police the Night Time Economy in Croydon Town Centre. At approximately 2350hrs, along with PS14ZD KING, I responded to a call for assistance from units outside the DICE Bar in High St Croydon. Upon our arrival, I could see a number of Police Officers at the location with two IC3 males who were in handcuffs. One of the males was in a white shirt with Officers by a Police Car; the other was in a Grey top and was standing with a Police Officer outside DICE Bar. He was then taken to the side of the Bar into a doorway. Both males had been ejected from DICE Bar. I remained with the Officer and the male at the side of the BAR whilst he was being given a dispersal notice under SEC 35, ASB Crime and Policing Act 2014. After a short while, I turned around, and I saw the Officers who were with the IC3 Male in the white shirt, struggling with him on the floor. I went over to see what was happening and I noticed that he was no longer in handcuffs, and the Officers were trying to reapply them. The male was very strong and was resisting the Officers attempts to contain him. I put a handcuff on his left wrist, S/N 219927, and linked it to the handcuff that was on his right wrist. I then took control of his head, and he was eventually led away and placed in the rear of a Police Van. I then returned to where the IC3 male in the Grey Jumper was standing, next to the side of DICE Bar. I remained there until he was issued with a dispersal notice. I then went with PS14ZD KING, and stood by the kerb




outside the Bar. I noticed two very young females sitting on the bench. One was IC4 and the other IC1. The IC1 female was being comforted by the IC4 female and had her head in her lap. I spoke with them and asked them if they were alright. The IC4 female stated that her friend had had too much to drink. I asked her where they had been, and she stated that they had been to an 18th Birthday Party at the Twilight Lounge, which is the Function Room in the basement of the DICE Bar. I asked her if they needed an ambulance, to which she informed me that they were waiting for her Father to pick them up. I asked her if her friend had taken anything else, or was on any medication that would put her in that condition. She stated that it just the amount of alcohol that she had drunk. I was unable to get any answer from the IC1 Female as she was so drunk and unable to speak, or understand what I was saying. Due to her condition, and how vulnerable they were, I remained with them until their lift arrived. The IC1 female was sick on the pavement whilst we were waiting. When their lift arrived, the IC4 Female attempted to get the IC1 Female to stand up so that they could get to the car, but she fell backwards onto the bench. I took hold of the IC Female's left arm and escorted her to the car. I then placed her in the back. Her friend, the IC4 female, took a bucket from the boot of the vehicle and gave it to her friend, as she had started to retch again. After her seatbelt was secured, I closed the door and returned to outside the DICE Bar.

I would describe the Female as being extremely drunk. She was unable to stand unaided, and at no time was she able to understand what was being said to her and speak coherently. She and her friend were extremely vulnerable and she should not have been allowed to be in that condition.

I then continued my patrols around the Town Centre until the Bars closed.

On Saturday 19th March 2016 I was on duty in full uniform on mobile patrol in marked police vehicle call sign ZD25N in company with fellow officer PC 402ZD Doran. As we were driving along the HIGH STREET CROYDON at approximately 23.30 my attention was drawn to a male being detained on the floor directly outside the Dice bar. The male was being detained by what looked like door staff and as we pulled up next to them PC 247ZD SOUCH was just arriving and was placing the male on the floor in a set of handcuffs, both myself and PC Doran went to assist. The male who I now know to be [REDACTED] was brought to his feet and I along with other officers remained with him while PC DORAN went to speak with staff within the Dice bar to see if there were any alleged offences [REDACTED] smelt strongly of alcohol and his eyes were of a glazed appearance, he was also very vocal in an aggressive manner, swearing constantly and had to be advised on several occasions to clam down and to stop swearing. PC DORAN returned a short while later and informed us that staff did not wish to substantiate any allegations against [REDACTED] and stated that [REDACTED] was drunk within the Dice bar and was causing a disturbance and was asked to leave where he became abusive to door staff and had to be forcibly ejected from the venue. Staff informed police that he would not be allowed back into the club that evening. [REDACTED] was released from the handcuffs and advised to leave the area and not to return to the Dice bar or he may be arrested, at this point a group of males came towards us and they appeared to know [REDACTED] as they asked him what was going on, one of the males asked me why [REDACTED] was being arrested?, I explained to the male that he was not being arrested and was free to leave but he has been disorderly and is clearly drunk and he has been advised to leave the area and not cause any further disturbance. This group of males then tried to get [REDACTED] to leave with them, [REDACTED] ignored them and started walking back towards the entrance to the Dice bar swearing and muttering to himself, I suspected he was going back to have an altercation with the door staff and I approached [REDACTED] and told him to go away or he would be arrested for being drunk and disorderly I would estimate I was approximately 1 metre from [REDACTED] at this point and he turned to face me and started walking towards me, I placed my arm directly in front of me with an open palm and said to [REDACTED] not to come any closer, [REDACTED] was acting in an agitated and un predictable manner and I did not want him to get to close to me as to be able to easily assault me. [REDACTED] continued to step towards me and as he touched the palm of my hand I shouted to him to "Get back and not to invade my personal space, he ignored this command and raised his had and with an open palm pushed it into my chest. I was joined immediately by PC DORAN and SOUCH and [REDACTED] was shouted at to "Get back" and was pushed back at the same time [REDACTED] tensed his body and lowered his head and I feared at this point he would assault either me or other officers at the scene. I along with PC DORAN and SOUCH approached [REDACTED] and took hold of his arms in order to place him in a set of hand cuffs but were unable to as he was resisting and pulling himself from our grip. [REDACTED] and officers ended up on the floor and we were then joined by other officers who were also attempting to place [REDACTED] in handcuffs, [REDACTED] had tensed his body and placed his arms under his body and it took officers several minutes and repeated commands to place [REDACTED] in handcuffs and when he eventually was he had to be almost carried to a

police van where he was placed in the caged area and conveyed to Croydon custody. I was aware that during this incident that PC SOUCH had arrested [REDACTED] for being drunk and disorderly in a public place. I then followed the police van back to custody and remained with [REDACTED] in custody until he calmed down enough for the hand cuffs to be removed and for me to then leave him with PC [REDACTED]

On Saturday 19th March 2016 I was on duty in full uniform, in the company of PC Purnell 691ZD, we were operating under the call sign of ZD25N in a marked police vehicle. At around 23:40 myself and PC 691ZD were driving along High Street, Croydon.

My attention was quickly drawn to a male on the floor outside DICE bar, he was lashing out with his arms towards bouncers in black clothing and was shouting at however I could not hear what he was saying. Myself and PC 691ZD quickly exited our vehicle and made our way over, we were quickly joined by local policing team officers including PC Souch 247ZD.

The male who I now know to be [redacted] was brought up from the floor, he continued to shout and swear saying that he wanted to go back into DICE bar jumping around in an aggressive manner, he was then placed into handcuffs by an officer, this was beneficial for his safety and other around him. [redacted] had clearly been drinking, he smelt strongly of intoxicating liquor, and his manner very un-rational that of someone who was under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

To establish why the [redacted] had been thrown out of the bar I then went to speak to bouncers at the location together with PC Souch. One of them stated that the male had been asked to leave after being too intoxicated and began getting aggressive towards them when they requested him to leave, they were not at this point alleging any allegations.

This information was relayed to [redacted] that the staff did not want him back in the bar, and that he needed to not enter or try to enter again, handcuffs were also taken off him as he also stated he would calm down.

[redacted] however once the handcuffs were off, stated that he was going back in, also saying that his phone was in there, to this I told him I would collect it for him and return it, he then stated that his phone wasn't actually in there. [redacted] was repeatedly told by myself and attending officers that he could not go back in there, not going back in and to leave the area. After [redacted] again made his way to enter the bar again, PC 691ZD was in front of him and told him to stay back, [redacted] then raised up his arms pushed his chest up to PC 691ZD. Fearing [redacted]

was about to assault myself or one of the other officers dealing I took hold of one of his arms and other officers took hold of his other arm, he was then guided to the floor. I then took my handcuffs out of my pouch to put them on to [redacted], again in an attempt to ensure the safety of [redacted], officers and other members of the public. [redacted] however was using all his strength to twist his body around, to make it difficult to place his handcuffs on. I repeatedly told him to stop resisting against officers. We were joined at some point by PS King an Inspector Roche, eventually handcuffs were placed on using two handcuffs. [redacted] was shortly after this brought up to his feet, he was then arrested by PC Souch for drunk and disorderly and transported to Windmill custody.

Vulnerable Victims Policy

Bar Staff & Managers

All staff and managers must ensure that customers do not become drunk. Look out for signs of slurred speech, glazed eyes, unsteady feet, spilling of drinks. If you believe a customer is drunk, do not serve. If in doubt, do not serve. The more a customer becomes drunk the greater the risk is to themselves and to others. **PREVENTION IS THE KEY.** We are responsible for the customer's health and welfare. We are responsible for reducing crime and disorder. It starts with you, so take it seriously. Do not think, you are not responsible for what happens to the person you are serving, because you are. Yes customers are here to have a good time, but we must take responsibility and ensure that they are able to leave our venue and get home safely, without hurting themselves or others.

The table below is a guide to help you notice the effects of alcohol on the body.

Check for ID, even if the door staff have checked the person's ID on entry, remember Challenge 21. Record the check on the till system. Don't take anyone's word that their friend is over 18.

Vulnerable victims

Who is a vulnerable victim?

Everyone inside our venue is potentially a vulnerable victim. When you look across the bar, don't just see customers', see the potential that a customer could be a vulnerable victim. As you will have noted from the effects of alcohol mentioned above, the greater one consumes alcohol the greater ones senses become impaired.

Intoxicated Persons:

If a person is drunk (see above for definition), stop serving alcohol, and instead offer a glass of water.

If you see a person is slouched in a chair or on the bar, call a manager or a member of the door team. Such customers could be in need of medical assistance.

The manager or head doorman will arrange for a licenced mini-cab service or black cab to take the person home. The first person (manager or doorman) to attend to the person will become "the responsible person". The responsible person will ensure that:

- a) An ambulance is called if there is any doubt that the individual will not be able to reach home safely. See table 1 above, High Risk.
- b) If it is suitable for the customer to go home in a taxi, call a licenced mini cab service or hail a black cab. Offer a glass of water while they are waiting for a taxi.
- c) Ensure that the customer is seated in a safe area while they are waiting for a taxi. We are in close proximity to a busy road and we do not want the customer to walk onto the road where they could be injured by a vehicle. If the customer insists on leaving the venue, there is a bench to the right of our venue, suggest that they take a seat while the taxi or ambulance arrives.
- d) Remain with the individual until they are in the ambulance or taxi.
- e) Try to obtain the name of the individual, and ask them if they have any medical illnesses or other important information that you can pass on to the ambulance service. Ask the individual if they would like you to call a friend or relative. Did they have any friends inside the venue, if so send someone else to find them.

- f) When the taxi or ambulance arrives, you MUST make sure that you about the necessary details such as the ambulance call sign/number, and if a taxi record the taxi's registration number and company details. There are a high number of taxi drivers that carry out sexual offences on vulnerable victims, and by recording the taxi registration there is a far greater chance of the police capturing the individual.

Measures to avoid Drink-Spiking in our venues

Drink Spiking: 'The introduction of a mind-altering substance into another person's drink without that person's knowledge. Drink Spiking is often the pre-cursor to more serious crimes.' As licensees we are the direct interface with potential victims, therefore have a vital role in protecting our customers from this crime. We are also often the first people to whom victims turn to for help.

1. Dispose of any unattended drinks (inform customers that this is our policy).
2. Educate our customers through anti- Drink-Spiking posters and information.
3. Ensure there is a staff and security presence on the floor.
4. Monitor suspicious behaviour.
5. VIGILANCE – train bar and door staff to be the customer's eyes and ears.
6. Decline requests from customers to add extra alcohol to unknowing individuals' drinks.
7. Keep an eye on possible victims.
8. As far as possible take steps to ensure lone females get home safely from our venues.
10. Ensure we have a first aider or 'nominated person' on each shift.

Drugs

Can you take possession of illegal drugs ?

Seizing & Finding Controlled Substances

(S.5) (4) Misuse of Drugs Act 1971.

- Knowing or suspecting the substance to be a controlled drug the person takes possession of it

for the purpose of preventing another from committing or continuing to commit an offence in connection with that drug and that as soon as possible after taking possession the person took all such steps as were reasonably open to them to destroy the drug or to deliver it into the custody of a person lawfully entitled to take custody of it;

Or

- Knowing or suspecting it to be a controlled drug, the person *takes possession of it for the purpose of delivering it into the custody of a person lawfully entitled to take custody of it and that as soon as possible after taking possession of it he took all such steps as were reasonably open to them to deliver it into the custody of such a person*
In compliance with the above, where staff take possession of a suspected controlled drug it is to be handed to the duty manager at the earliest opportunity, before going off duty. The duty

manager will take action to hand the substance to the police for disposal or for the police's retention as evidence in an on going police enquiry.

What our employees need to do:

If you are concerned that prohibited activity might be taking place on the premises, you should always look into it further. If this confirms or supports your suspicion, you will need to report the matter to the licensee, Premise Licence holder and Designated Premise Supervisor, Doorsafe personnel (if on duty).

If you are aware of a prohibited activity-taking place on the premises, you must decide on a course of action. Actions that might be taken, once you have made colleagues aware of your concerns, include instruction those involved to stop that activity; or other steps including warnings, instruction them to leave the premises, or exclusion for a period of time.

Ideally these actions need to be carried out by the licensee or Doorsafe personnel, who in turn can liaise with the Police. Your obligation under Section 8 is to prevent the prohibited activity. If you fail to take reasonable steps available to you to prevent the prohibited activity, then you may be committing an offence. Ensure that you keep accurate written notes of drug related incidents and steps that have been taken.

Awareness

The signs to look for of both users and dealer are as follows:

Signs of drug use – materials

- Torn-up beer mats/cigarette packets/bits of cardboard left on tables or in ashtrays.
- Foam stuffing taken from seats, bits of foam left around.
- Roaches (home-made filter tips from cannabis cigarettes)
- Small packets made of folded paper, card or foil.
- Empty sweet wrappings left in toilets.
- Payment with tightly rolled banknotes, or notes that have been tightly rolled.
- Traces of blood or powder on banknotes.
- Drinking straws left in toilets.
- Traces of powder on toilet seats or other surfaces in toilets – or obviously wiped-clean surfaces.
- Syringes (danger of infection – do not touch with bare hands and should be disposed of properly via the college reception)
- Spoons left in toilets.
- Pieces of burned tinfoil.

Signs of drug use – physical symptoms

- Very dilated pupils.
- Excessive sniffling, dripping nose, watering or red eyes.
- Sudden severe cold symptoms following trip to toilet / garden / car park.
- White mark / traces of powder around nostrils.

Signs of drug use – behaviour

- Excessive giggling, laughing at nothing, non-stop talking.
- Unnaturally dozey, vacant staring, sleepy euphoria.
- Non-stop movement, jigglng about, dancing.
- Gagging or retching actions.
- Excessive consumption of soft drinks.
- Sudden, inexplicable tearfulness or fright.
- An elevation in aggressive behaviour.
- Any marked alteration in behaviour following trip to toilet / garden / car park.

Signs of dealing

- A person holding court, with succession of visitors who only stay with them for a short time.
 - A person making frequent trips to the toilet or garden or car park, followed by different persons/people each time.
 - People exchanging small packages or cash, often done in secretive manner, but may be quite open to avoid suspicion.
 - Furtive, conspiratorial behaviour – huddling in corners and whispering.
 - Conversation includes frequent reference to drugs, slang names.
- Dealers are not identifiable by appearance, they may be very respectable-looking.

Searching

A condition will be attached to the customers right of entry, namely "That persons entering the premises maybe asked to submit to a speculative search for illegal substances". This entry condition will be advertised on a poster(s) outside the premises in a position(s) that customers seeking to enter the premises could not reasonably fail to see.

Once beyond the door staff and inside the vestibule or payment area of the premises customers are politely approached at random or with cause. They are told that they have been selected in accordance with the policy and informed that it is intended to subject them to a speculative search should they wish to gain entry to the premises. They are informed that they have the right to refuse but they will not be granted access to the premises if they do so.

Should the person refuse to submit to a search then they are informed that this is a condition of entry as displayed outside and inside the premises and they will be pleasantly asked to leave. If they agree to be searched they are asked to accompany the staff to an area set-aside for this purpose.

In a manner that cannot be deemed threatening and in the presence of two or more staff, at least one of the same gender as the person, the policy is again explained to them. The individual is again asked if they are prepared to consent to a search of their outer garments and personal effects. Again, should the person refuse to submit to a search then they are informed that this is a condition of entry as displayed outside and inside the premises and they will be pleasantly asked to leave.

All searches to be recorded in the Search Record Book.

If substances are discovered the person will be informed that it would be desirable that they remain until the police attend to assist in clarifying matters. Staff will ask them what the substance is. Staff should be very careful that the person cannot retrieve the articles from them.

If no drugs are discovered, the person will be thanked and allowed to enter the premises without further hindrance and thanked for their assistance and understanding.

If somebody has managed to enter the premises and is suspected of being in possession of drugs they maybe approached and asked courteously to accompany the staff to a quieter place. They are then asked if they agree to the search being conducted in accordance with the entry requirements.

If it is decided to make an approach to a person or persons within a group try to isolate the individuals before doing so. This will avoid undue confrontation and bravado on their part.

Again, should the person refuse to submit to a search then they are informed that this is a condition of entry as displayed outside and inside the premises and they will be pleasantly asked to leave.

It is vital that you take extreme care when searching people or clothing as needles or sharps are often concealed. If any member of staff is pricked seek immediate hospital advice.

Detaining Persons

If substances are discovered on a customer the person must be informed that it would be desirable that they remain until the Police attend to assist in clarifying matters.

If the person states that they would like to leave and asks if they can leave then they should be told that it would be desirable if they remain until the police attend. HOWEVER, if the person insists on leaving they should be allowed to do so but their proof of identity should be retained.

Our experience of operating this type of policy is that most people will wait until the police attend. During this period the individual should be observed to ensure that they do not dispose of other items. Upon arrival of the police the finder of the substance and the witness should relate to the police in the presence and hearing of the accused what has taken place. The drugs are handed to the police (who do have the powers to arrest on suspicion of a suspected offence). The police will then caution and arrest the individual and escort them away from the premises.

We will try and ensure that there are toilet attendants on duty on weekends, and they will also be tasked.

Why do we use plastic glasses ?

We can prevent serious injury by changing over to plastic. If the bar is busy, change to plastics. The premises licence states that we must change at 9pm, however we can change to plastics earlier, perhaps 8pm, or even 5pm, if it is busy there is a risk of crime and disorder. If it is busy and you find yourself thinking "maybe we should change to plastics", that means we should change to plastic. Express your thoughts and feelings to a manager immediately.

Do not leave any empty glasses on the floor. Not just because it looks bad to customers, but also because empty glasses can be used as weapons. When you see an empty glass, don't think "oh,

there's an empty glass", instead think "That's a weapon there just waiting to hurt someone, I better pick it up quick".

We do not tolerate disorderly behaviour. Alert the manager and the door team to such behaviour.

Lost property

Look out for lost property and fill in the lost property form. At the start of the shift the manager will assign one person to this task.

Be vigilant to unattended bags.

The manager on duty will be the point of help in the club on busy nights.

Should you find a mobile phone, hand it to a manager. The manager will record the make and model (IMEI number) of the phone and send it to the police after each weekend.

We will put on our screens prevention messages which will be flashed at regular intervals during the night.

Crime Maps

We have crime maps of each floor to help identify "hot spots". At the end of your shift if you feel that there is an area which on the night became a crime spot, let the manager know and he or she will add it to the crime map.

ID Scanner

All customer entering the venue will have to have their ID scanned. Should a customer cause any trouble, they will be barred on the ID Scanner.

Illness or Injury

If anyone is injured or ill, you must alert the manager, or door staff, and or the first aider immediately. Talk to the ill or injured person to ascertain what the problem is, ask "are you ill or injured" Ask if they are on any medication and pass as much information onto the person dealing with the matter.

A copy of this aid memoir is in the staff room, behind the bar, on the manager and the head door staff.

Exit Routes

It is the managers role to make sure all exit routes are clear. Bar staff must not place anything to block the exit routes. Think of our customers safety in the event of an emergency.

Last Orders

Managers will inform Bar Staff an hour before last orders. Bar Staff must communicate the time of the last orders, to the customers from that moment on.

CCTV

Management to check the CCTV is in working order everyday twice a day.

Dispersal

Managers must ensure that the dispersal policy is in operation.

Door Team

Every customer has to put their ID through the scanner.

The door team have been provided with search wands and they must be used at the front door where others people can see. Managers must ensure that the door team use the wands. Searching is important to prevent drugs entering the premises.

Safer Croydon Radio

Managers and door team must communicate on the radio if customers have been rejected from the door so that they do not enter other nearby venues.

This statement refers to an incident where a female was arrested for being drunk and disorderly in a public place and for assault on police officers.

On SUNDAY 27th March 2016 I was on duty in full uniform including high visibility jacket on Operation EQUINOX in CROYDON TOWN CENTRE.

At approximately 0400hrs I was on foot patrolling HIGH STREET CROYDON together with PC 183ZD KENNEDY and PC 493ZD CRAWLEY. We were stationary opposite DICE BAR on the other side of the road. The bar was closing and people were coming out. I noticed a female which I now know as [redacted] who came out of the bar drunk and unsteady on her feet and fell on the floor directly outside the main entrance. She was helped by a female who appeared to be her friend but the friend was not able to lift the drunk female. One of the male security guards grabbed her and sat her gently on the bench outside DICE. There was a group of males and females on the bench and it would appear they knew each other. Two females were talking to her and holding her on each side to prevent her falling off the bench. At this stage [redacted] was calm and I was not concerned about her behaviour. I was monitoring the HIGH STREET.

After approximately 15 - 20 minutes PC KENNEDY, PC CRAWLEY and I crossed the road and walked towards the [redacted] where the crowd was gathering.

Our attention was drawn to the same drunk female which I noticed earlier. She was laying on the pavement outside [redacted] HIGH STREET. [redacted] was breathing but unresponsive. I pinched her ear to get her attention but there was no response. PC CRAWLEY requested an ambulance. I could smell alcohol from the female.

[redacted] then opened her eyes and started talking to us, her speech was slurred. There was a crowd of approximately 10 people next to her. They said they were her friends which [redacted] confirmed. She said that one of the males is her boyfriend and her 'little sister' is there as well. The group of males and females confirmed they know her and left shortly after without helping her. Two female friends stood with her and talked to her.

█████ was concerned about her bag being stolen. She then stated that her phone had been stolen. The phone was later found in her hand. █████ was up and down, she was confused and unable to confirm her date of birth. She was upset and started crying and later became aggressive and said to officers that she would stab us. Her eyes were half closed and speech was slurred.

Together with PC KENNEDY we managed to sat her against the wall for her safety. Both officers tried to convinced her to remain in this safe position but she suddenly decided to stand up. PC KENNEDY and I were holding her asking her to stay on the floor and wait for an ambulance. █████ stood up and wanted to walk but suddenly lost control . PC KENNEDY and I managed to grabbed her to prevent her hitting the floor. She was sat on the floor. Her behaviour was still up and down and she was shouting about her phone being stolen. She then found the phone hidden in her bra. █████ made number of attempts to stand up and on each occasion she had be helped not to fall on the floor.

Solo LAS paramedic arrived on scene at approximately 0430hrs but █████ refused to speak to him saying she is fine. She kept saying that she needs to go back to DICE to collect her bag. The paramedic tried to asked number of questions but she wouldn't listen and kept saying she is feeling fine and then ignored him completely.

The group of people who were initially with her started walking off saying that they don't have time for that anymore.

Another male arrived who claimed to know █████ and was happy to take her home in a car. She confirmed that they know each other and wanted to go with him. The male helped her out and they walked up the HIGH STREET.

After another 5 minutes I noticed some sort of altercation outside █████ and I could see the female pacing up and down. She was shouting and pointing at pople. We walked towards her. █████ was shouting that the male who was helping her had stolen her mobile phone. She then produced the same mobile phone from her bra. She was still happy to go away with this friend. They walked down towards a black AUDI █████ which was parked outside █████. The driver noticed that I was doing checks on the vehicle on the main channel and refused to take them on. █████ became vary aggressive, she was shouting and squaring up to people around her saying that she would stab them.

Whilst I was still speaking to the driver of the black AUDI I noticed PC CRAWLEY and PC KENNEDY walking towards █████. They grabbed her both side. At 0450hrs █████ was arrested by PC CRAWLEY for being drunk and disorderly in a public place. █████ was then cautioned by PC CRAWLEY who tried to apply cuffs. Female was resisting, kicking, shouting and constantly moving around. PC KENNEDY was on her right side holding her, PC CRAWLEY was behind █████ still trying to put the cuffs on. I grabbed █████ by her left arm and moved her hand behind so the cuffs can be put on. █████ was still violent she kicked my legs causing pain as she was wearing long boots with approximately 3 inches heels.

At his stage [redacted] became even more violent and started kicking officers. She was placed on the floor. I was holding her head to prevent her injuring herself.

Station van arrived and officers tried to walked her to the van which parked next to us. [redacted] became violent again and refused to walk and started kicking officers. I believe she kicked me again whilst we were trying to walk her the van but I didn't look down.

[redacted] had to be carried to the van, she was constantly shouting, swearing and kicking. PC KENNEDY was holding her right arm and I was holding the left side. [redacted] was on her knee when she was pushed into the van and at this stage she was pretending to be unresponsive. We paused for a short time to check on her and then lifted her and put into the cage of the van. [redacted] stood up and kicked PC KENNEDY and tried to kick me but I jumped back from the cage door to avoid the kick. When we closed the van's door I could hear her shouting and constantly kicking the van. PC KENNEDY and PC CRAWLEY were travelling with the prisoner in the station van.

I then drove on my own to WINDMILL ROAD CUSTODY CENTRE and walked into custody, I could hear a female shouting and swearing through the closed door even before entering custody. [redacted] was still in the holding cell. She was laying on a blue custody mattress. PC 368ZD EBDON was protecting her head and holding her head when she was vomiting. PC CRAWLEY was holding her by both arms and asking her to calm down. PC KENNEDY was holding her both legs protecting other officers from being kicked.

I went to get some kitchen paper to clean up the mattress from her sick and took over from PC KENNEDY. I was holding her legs, she was still intending to kick us. She was shouting saying that her bag has been stolen and she had some drugs in there.

[redacted] was eventually taken to the custody sergeant and DDO who started booking her in. [redacted] became calmer and responded to number of questions. She then started being aggressive and said that she would urinate on the floor. She then refused to stand up at which point she was taken to cell number 6. I grabbed her left arm. She was put in the cell of which she was still kicking the door and shouting.

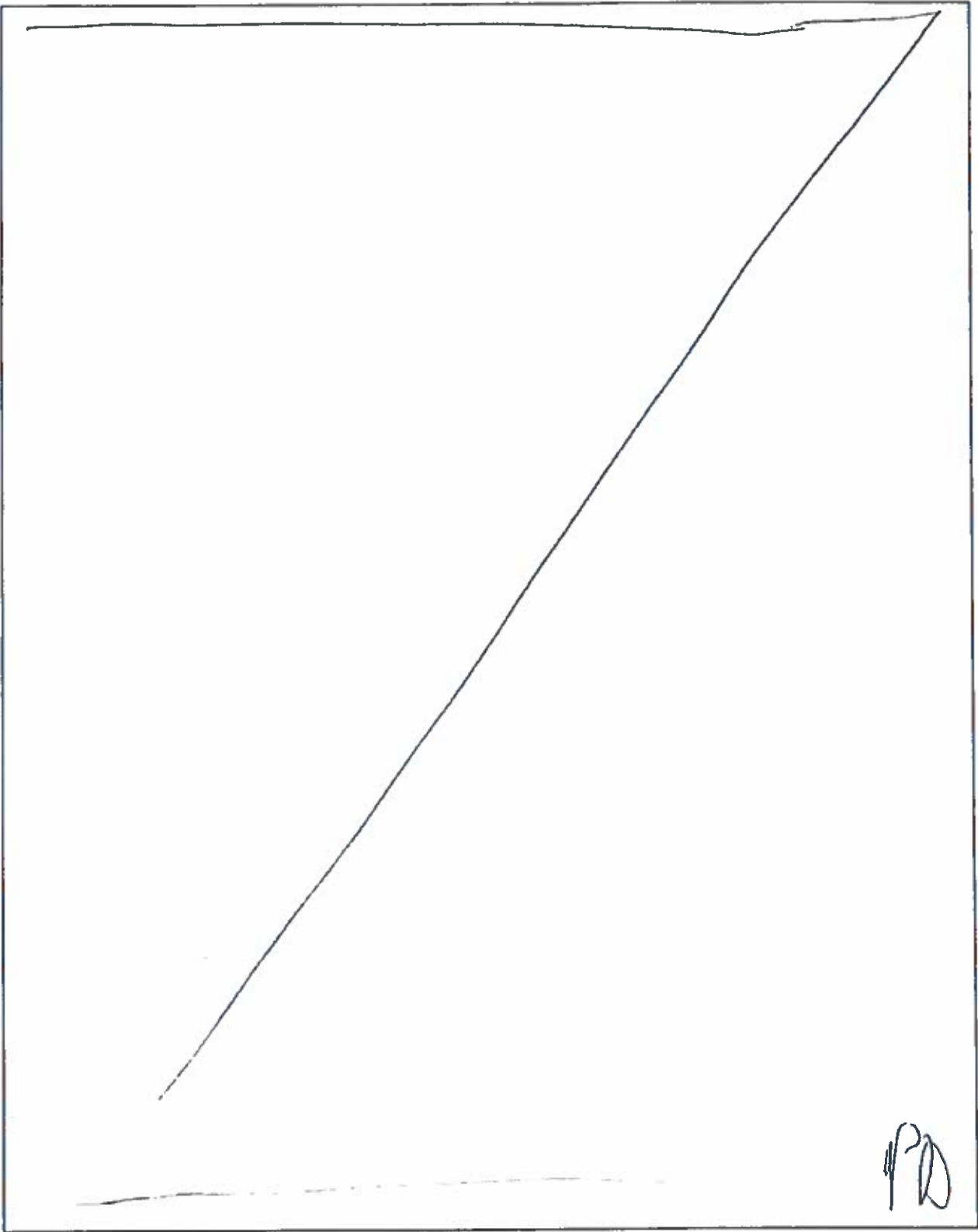
Initially when I was dealing with [redacted] and used force to hold her in a safe position I used Common Law as I had a genuine honestly held belief that she was going to hurt herself. I used reasonable force to save her life and prevent her falling on the floor.

Later when [redacted] became aggressive and violent I used reasonable force under Section 117 PACE.

I would describe [redacted] as a Black light skinned female, F5'00, slim, black long heir, shaved right side. She was wearing a white patterned top and a black top, black skinny jeans and long black laced up boots with a large heel.

On Sunday 27th March 2016 I was on duty in full uniform in Croydon town centre as part of operation Govern. Operation Govern is an initiative to help control the night time economy in Croydon Town Centre. I was posted with Pc Kennedy 183ZD and Pc Dolski 845ZD, we were walking along Croydon High Street, on the same side as the pubs, towards [redacted] from dice bar, when at approximately 04:20 hours I noticed a female laying on the floor outside [redacted], High Street Croydon. I ran over with my colleagues and saw a female I now know to be [redacted] lying unconscious on the floor. [redacted] was IC4 in appearance, with black hair of which the right half was shaved, skinny build, with a stretcher ear ring in her right ear; she was wearing a white top with a pattern on, a black corset underneath, black skinny jeans and knee high black lace up boots. I tried to rouse [redacted] by shaking her hip and calling out to her, giving her simple instructions like open your eyes and asking for her name, to this [redacted] made no response. 845ZD tested [redacted] pain response by squeezing her ear lobes to see if she had any reaction, which she did not.


At 0421 Hours I called an ambulance on CAD 1136/23Mar16, in this I mentioned that the female was unconscious but breathing. [redacted] regained consciousness about a minute later but could not confirm her name and address or any other details; she was confused and had clearly had a lot to drink. When speaking to [redacted] she got upset and did not understand what she was doing or where she was, she kept becoming aggressive shouting about stabbing someone then screaming hysterically. She did state that the first time she fell she hit the back of her head, this was checked by 845ZD and there were no visible marks or lumps however a clear view was obstructed by hair. It was clear [redacted] was drunk as her speech was slurred, she smelt of alcohol and when she attempted to stand her legs gave way. I updated the ambulance that [redacted] was going in and out of consciousness and was very confused. [redacted] continually tried to stand up, against police advice, and every time fell back to the floor hitting her head. Various friends of [redacted]s came over to try and speak to her and take her home but she either became aggressive resulting in them leaving or they were not willing to take her

home with them or provide her with a means of transport. When the LAS solo responder turned up [redacted] refused any medical treatment stating she was not drunk, she was fine and that this is just wasting everyone's time. During [redacted] shouting she kept repeating that she had been beaten and her bag stolen, I tried to gain more details for this but she kept screaming that she will stab every female in Croydon until she gets her bag back. I managed to find out that [redacted] had been attacked in DICE Bar, the club she had been drinking at. A Cris has been put on for Actual Bodily Harm as [redacted] states she was hit in the face by an Asian Female, resulting in marks to her face. It is unclear at what stage the discolouration to her face occurred, as [redacted] fell to the floor on a number of occasions when friends were trying to take her home.

183ZD and 845ZD were on either side of [redacted] as I tried to speak to her, they were holding her arms and preventing her from standing up as this would have led to further injury. At this point the LAS member tried to speak to [redacted] again but she refused to listen and continued to scream about being beaten and having everything stolen from her. [redacted] was concerned that someone will be using her contactless credit cards. She kept shouting about her phone being stolen, however her phone was in her possession or polices at all times. Whenever [redacted] asked for her phone police handed it back to her but it would shortly end up on the floor again. At approximately 0440 hours a male alleging to know [redacted] arrived and stated he will take her home, he was IC3, approximately 23 years of age, with braids and a lazy eye. We confirmed with [redacted] that she knew the male to which she replied "Yes" and she was happy to leave with him. Therefore when [redacted] stood up with the help of officers she was then handed to the Male. She willingly walked, and was assisted up the road towards [redacted]. Officers kept an eye out and noticed that [redacted] had began to shout again, she looked aggressive and began to square up to people pushing them away. Officers quickly made there way outside [redacted] to diffuse the situation, when they got there the Male stated that he was being accused of stealing [redacted] phone. I went to speak to [redacted] and remind her that she had put her phone down her bra, at this point she checked and realised she was still in possession of her mobile. The Male then picked up [redacted] and carried her towards his mate's car stating he was taking her straight home. The Vehicle he intended to get into was VRM [redacted], however the driver of this car refused to take her. [redacted] continued to shout and swear in the street, threatening to stab every female in Croydon, she was not calming down and was posing a risk to herself and other members of the public. 183ZD and I had a brief conversation deciding that [redacted] behaviour meant she needed to be arrested for Drunk and Disorderly. I approached her from her left side; I placed my hand on her left arm and put my handcuff on her left wrist, while doing this 183ZD approached her right side to control her arm. [redacted] was kicking off and screaming, she lashed out with her legs and would not comply, one of these kicks contacted 183ZD in the left shin. I told her she was "Under arrest for Drunk and disorderly" to which she continued to scream and swear. With the help of 845ZD we took [redacted] to the ground where we managed to get the second cuff onto her right wrist. [redacted] was shouting and kicking her legs out. I cautioned her at

0450 hours by saying "You are under arrest for drunk and disorderly this is because you are drunk in a public place and acting in a disorderly manner. You are shouting and swearing and when asked to leave you have not complied. You do not have to say anything but it may harm your defence if you do not mention when questioned something which you later rely on in court anything you do say may be given in evidence." To which [REDACTED] made no direct response but continued to scream and shout. Space was booked at Windmill road custody and a van called to our location on the hurry up. CAD 1271/27MAR16 was created for the arrest. We tried to move [REDACTED] onto her side as to not restrict her airways, but throughout she continued to resist, I gave her verbal commands to stop resisting but she did not pay any attention to these. A couple of minute's later when the van arrived 183ZD, 845ZD and myself picked up [REDACTED] was asked her to walk to the van, however when she stood up with the support of officers she instantly began to kick out, some of these hitting 183ZD and 845ZD. She kicked backwards hitting 183ZD in the Left shin with her foot, she was told to stop kicking out. [REDACTED] was screaming and shouting, not paying any attention to commands. The operator of the Van then walked around to assist us. Due to the fact [REDACTED] would not walk and kept kicking her legs out, I took hold of one of her legs and raised her off the ground. [REDACTED] was facing the floor and carried to the cage of the van. When we lowered her legs to get her in the van she kicked backwards, attempting to kick 845ZD in the shin. 183ZD lowered her head to put her off balance and I tried to move her legs into the cage. Once officers had got [REDACTED] in the cage she went unconscious, we got the paramedic to come to the scene but by the time he walked round the van she had began to scream and shout again. The cage was shut and she began to kick the cage walls with force. I entered the centre of the Van where I informed [REDACTED], at 0457 hours, that she was further arrested for assault on police times two (2), due to the fact when arrested she began to kick out which resulted in two police officers being kicked in the legs. I then reminded her that she was still under caution. To this [REDACTED] continued to scream and shout. While going back to Windmill [REDACTED] sat on the floor of the van and kept heaving, resulting in some saliva being on the floor of the cage. When we arrived at windmill road custody [REDACTED] had calmed down and agreed to walk into the holding room. Once in the holding room I held onto [REDACTED] shoulders while she sat on the bench to prevent her from falling forward, when I asked her to sit back she stated "I don't care, I have lost everything." Then she mentioned something about the person who has stolen her bag will be doing all her drugs and spending all her money. When asked about the drugs she stated that she was doing coke in the toilets of DICE and sometimes does cannabis. However when re-asked if she had taken anything today she stated no I don't do drugs, [REDACTED] then changed her mind again and admitted she had done drugs last week. At this point [REDACTED] began to shout about her bag again and stood up. I kept hold of her right arm as she stood up, I was aware that her legs began to stamp and she was becoming increasingly aggressive. [REDACTED] kicked forward and at this moment 183ZD and I looked at one another and decided to take her to the ground before she injured us or herself. PC EBDON 368ZD entered the Cell to secure [REDACTED]'s head, while I had hold of her arms and had one hand placed on her hip. 183ZD was restraining her legs as she continued to kick and shout. A

Mat was brought into the holding room which we placed [redacted]'s head on, on this she spat out saliva several times. [redacted] behaviour went up and down, she would start to comply so restraint was loosened but moments later she would become aggressive again. We were in the holding cell restraining [redacted] to the floor for about 15 Minutes. When we walked to the booking in desk [redacted] walked with assistance of officers and began to answer questions. She then stated that if officers didn't take her to the toilet immediately she was going to urinate there and then. 368ZD searched [redacted] and we walked her down to cell six (6) where she went to the toilet. As we walked back out the cell towards the custody desk [redacted] became uncooperative again, she would not walk and allowed her legs to give way. She would not approach the custody desk and instead began to lash out, the custody sergeant told us to take her back to the cell. [redacted] would not walk at this point so I lifted up one of her legs, while the other officers helped me to carry her back into cell 6. Once in the cell I placed her on the floor and retreated from the cell.

The power I used for my use of force was Section 117 of PACE, as I was executing my power of arrest and the force was used to prevent harm to herself and others, but to also get [redacted] safely into police custody.

After the incident I spoke to both 183ZD and 845ZD who stated that they have pain to their legs. 183ZD also has slight reddening to the knee and a small scratch below his knee cap.

On Sunday the 27th of March 2016 I was on duty in full uniform with PC Crawley 493ZD and PC Dolski 845ZD. We were deployed on Operation Govern which is aimed at tackling violence against the person in Croydon Town Centre.

We were stood opposite DICE bar on Croydon High Street. At about 0400 hours my attention was drawn to a IC4 Female, wearing a black jacket, white t shirt with a pattern, black jeans and black knee high boots, as she appeared to be very drunk. I now know this female to be [redacted] of [redacted]. As she was walking out of DICE she fell down the steps and was sat on the floor outside the entrance. Security staff has approached her and lift her to her feet and brought her over to some nearby benches, where she was joined with a group of females who appeared to be her friends. About 5 minutes later my attention was drawn to her again as I saw her stand up and stagger forward, fall and land on her front on the floor. She was immediately helped to her feet by her group of friends and they all walked off down the High Street towards [redacted]. She was not walking unaided and needed the assistance of her friends to walk. At this stage I did not believe her behaviour was disorderedly.

About 0415 hours we started walking down the High Street towards [redacted]. As we have approached [redacted] I have seen [redacted] lying on the floor, there were a number of males nearby that appeared to be trying to talk to her. We have approached and PC 493ZD has attempted to communicate with her. At first she was unconscious and unresponsive, but breathing, so an ambulance was called for assistance. After a couple of minutes she has woken up and started to talk to PC 493ZD. [redacted] was clearly very drunk, her speech was slurred, she could not stand and she smelt strongly of alcohol. The males that were stood with her stated that they did not know her. After a couple of minutes [redacted] has attempted to stand up, against the advice of myself and PC 845ZD. She

has struggled with us and got to her feet. Within seconds she has fallen backwards, landing on her bum. Myself and PC 845ZD managed to catch her before she fell any further or hit her head.

██████████ was very disorientated and was up and down between upset and aggressive. ██████████ alleged that she had been psychically assaulted in DICE bar but could give no details about what happened, only stated that it was 4 girls. She later stated that it happened in ██████████ and also in ██████████. She has also stated that she has lost her bag, and her phone. Her phone was in her bra, and she had to be reminded of this a number of times. A number of her friends have approached and attempted to speak to her, but she would not listen to them. Her friends confirmed that she had not been to ██████████ or ██████████. After a couple of minutes with each friend, they appeared to get bored of waiting with her and left. ██████████ has attempted to get up several more times and had to be held in place by myself and PC 845ZD. This was to prevent her from causing harm to herself as I believed if she stood up she would fall and would risk a head injury. I was using Common Law to prevent harm to her and others.

A single responder paramedic has arrived and I have gone over to him and briefed him on ██████████'s condition. ██████████ has refused to speak to the paramedic. A male friend has approached and has stated that he would look after her and take her home. ██████████ confirmed that she knew the male. The male was advised to take hold of her and walk with her slowly. They have then walked off towards ██████████. When they got to ██████████ ██████████ appeared to push the male away slightly and stand on her own. She then started pacing back and forth outside ██████████ and was shouting and pointing and people stood outside with their takcaway. The people she was shouting at did not appear to know her and started moving away. We have approached ██████████ and the male again to see what the problem was. The male stated that she had accused him of stealing her phone. ██████████ was once again reminded that the phone was in her bra, which she then produced. The male has then walked her to a nearby car. The driver of the vehicle who was a friend of the male has then refused to take ██████████ due to her behaviour.

██████████ has then become verbally abusive and has become aggressive and started throwing her arms around. She has shouted 'I'll stab all the girls in Croydon'. She has then approached 2 females outside ██████████. Myself and PC 493ZD have then had a brief conversation and have decided that ██████████ needed to be arrested for drunk and disorderly. I have taken hold of right arm at the wrist and PC 493ZD has taken hold of her left arm. PC 493ZD has arrested ██████████ and placed a handcuff on her left wrist. As this has happened ██████████ began screaming and pulling away from us. She has begun to kick out and has kicked out and down, hitting my left knee and down my shin. I have then decided that due to her behaviour and that she had just kicked me with high heeled boots, that she needed to be placed on the floor so that we could gain proper control of her. I have pushed her right shoulder towards the ground causing her to lean forward towards the ground and go to her knees. I have lowered her upper half to the ground, ensuring that her head did not hit the ground. Once ██████████ was on the

ground her I have brought her right hand to the rear of her and placed it in the handcuff. We have then called for a van on the hurry up. While on the floor [REDACTED] was still screaming and shouting 'Get the fuck off me'. She was also struggling while on the floor. After about 2 minutes a van arrived. We have lifted [REDACTED] to her feet. Once on her feet she has again begun struggling and kicking out. To avoid being kicked again I has pushed her head down and raised her arms above her head. This is a approved technique to keep the prisoner off balance and makes it more difficult to kick out. While walking [REDACTED] to the van she has managed to raise her head up and kicked out again. She has kicked me in the left shin again. I was also informed that she had kicked PC 845ZD too. We have then lifted her off the ground completely, I had hold of her right arm and we carried her to the van. When we got to the rear of van we have attempted to place her in the back of the van. She would not stand to step up into the van and went limp for about 5 seconds. After this she has begun struggling again and kicking out. Myself and PC 845ZD have lifted her into the van cage. PC 845ZD has gone into the cage with her to get her in. As PC 845ZD was backing out of the cage, [REDACTED] has raised one of her legs and kicked out of the cage, missing PC 845ZD and what would have been about chest height. We have then closed the cage door. I was made aware that PC 493ZD has arrested [REDACTED] for assault on me and assault on PC 845ZD. Once the cage door was closed [REDACTED] begun kicking the door with force. On the journey to Croydon Custody she was kicking the cage a number of times.

As we approached custody she appeared to calm considerably and begun to engage with us and answer our questions. When we arrived she was calm but upset. She was asked if she was going to remain calm and she stated she was. Myself and PC 493ZD have then walked her into custody and sat her in a holding cell. While sat on the bench she stated that she had been doing cocaine in the club, and that the person that stole her bag was going to be doing all her drugs. After about 5 minutes in the holding cell [REDACTED] again started to become aggressive. She was pulling away from officers and screaming. [REDACTED] began stamping her feet on the floor and began to kick forward. This made me believe that she was going to kick myself or PC 493ZD. Due to this I have decided to take her to the floor. I was stood on her left side at this stage and had hold of her left arm. I have pushed her arm forward and down, lowering her to the ground, ensuring her head did not hit the floor. Once she was on the floor 368ZD has come to assist and taken hold of [REDACTED]'s head for safety. PC 845ZD has also come to assist and restrained her legs. While PC 845ZD was restraining her legs I have removed her heeled boots to prevent harm to officers. During this time someone has provided us with a mattress and some tissues and [REDACTED] was wrtching as if getting sick and spitting.

After about 15 minutes we have been told custody was ready and we have lifted [REDACTED] to her feet and walked her over to the custody desk. She appeared then to calm slightly but was still upset. A couple of minutes into the hooking in procedure she stated she needed the toilet so was searched by PC 368ZD and was allowed to go to the



toilet in cell 6. When walking back to the custody desk [REDACTED] began shouting again and pulled away from officers and had to be restrained. I took hold of her right arm. [REDACTED] was then carried back to cell 6, where she was placed on the floor on a mattress. As we were all leaving the cell she attempted to get to her feet and move towards the door but the door was closed.

This incident has left me with a small red scratch slightly below left knee about 2 millimetres wide. My use of force for this incident is 117 of PACE.

This statement refers to the use of force and actions I used on a prisoner when assisting other officers after arrest. On Sunday 27th March 2016 at approximately 05.05 my colleagues PC Crawley 493ZD, PC KENNEDY 183ZD and PC DOLSKI 845ZD arrived at Windmill Road Custody Centre with a prisoner who had been arrested for being Drunk and Disorderly and Assault on Police. I waited in custody for the arrival of the van, and when I saw my colleagues arrive at 05.05 I entered the holding cell- I believed they may be further assaulted or the female prisoner may cause harm to herself. All the force I used was under Common Law, to prevent the female from harming herself or harming others.

While we were waiting in the holding cell, the prisoner who I now know to be called [REDACTED] began to struggle with officers and shout loudly. She was in handcuffs and we placed her down onto the mat provided by custody. I was at the head end of her body, holding her head lightly but firmly down onto the mat to ensure she did not hurt herself or anyone else, with her head to the side so she was always able to breathe. She began to heave and spit, and I ensured she could still breathe properly and rubbed her neck and head to try and calm her down. She was lying on the mat still in handcuffs but in the recovery position. She had my full attention at all times. When we were called up to book [REDACTED] in a while later, I assisted my colleagues in holding her up as she was unable to stand up by herself. I was lightly holding her at this point- simply to keep her upright. I thoroughly searched [REDACTED] to which I did not find anything on her.

Once the booking in procedure had finished, [REDACTED] was told she would be going into the cell. She immediately struggled with officers again and myself and my colleagues had to carry her into her cell. I was holding the middle of her body this time, and supported her into the cell. I helped lay her down in the recovery position once again. She began to heave and spit and I ensured she could breathe by lifting her head slightly and listening to her breaths. Once we were satisfied she was safe, we left the cell to return to the book in desk. A few minutes later, a custody officer asked for a female officer to assist in checking on [REDACTED]. Once we were inside the cell, I could see that [REDACTED] was lying on the floor. Upon approach to [REDACTED], I could see she was breathing but she was un responsive.

I rolled [redacted] into the proper recovery position and tried to wake her. She had my full attention again and when she eventually became responsive and tried to stand up, I left the cell, satisfied that she was safe and able to breathe properly.

I did not at any point use any excess force, I was simply assisting [redacted] in either standing up straight, or helping her to breathe and stay still when she was struggling. All force used was necessary to prevent [redacted] from harming herself, myself or any of my colleagues. PC Grace Ebdon

On Sunday 27th March 2016, PC Crawley 493ZD, PC DOLSKI 845ZD and PC KENNEDY 183ZD were on patrol on Croydon High Street as part of Operation Govern. At approximately 04:30 they noticed a female lying on the floor unconscious, heavily intoxicated. After dealing with her (when she decided to stand up), the victim alleged to officers that she has been punched in the nightclub. When PC Crawley 493zd attempted to gather more information regarding this, the female was so drunk that she could only explain that she was in the toilet and a female she recognised punched her and she was assaulted. The female was in no fit state to explain anything else to Police regarding this assault. She was not in any fit state to tell Police her own name and address either.

The victim then alleged that when she had left the nightclub, four asian females had approached her and one of them had stolen her bag. A brief description of the suspect was given by the victim, however from being so drunk she was drifting in and out of consciousness again.

The victim was arrested shortly after for being Drunk and Disorderly, and then assault on Police.

She stated her handbag was a Chanel bag with all of her makeup, bank cards, money and drugs in it. She had a slight bruise to her face and lip however this could be from being so drunk and falling her several times.

The victim had walked past Police several times outside the nightclub before making these allegations and did not mention it to Police until she was on the floor surrounded by Police and then arrested.

Upon arrival to Custody, the female was so intoxicated that she could not stand up by herself and was struggling with officers and spitting on the floor.

Police have advised the victim to cancel her bank card at the earliest opportunity.

A statement was not obtained from the victim due to her being heavily drunk.
