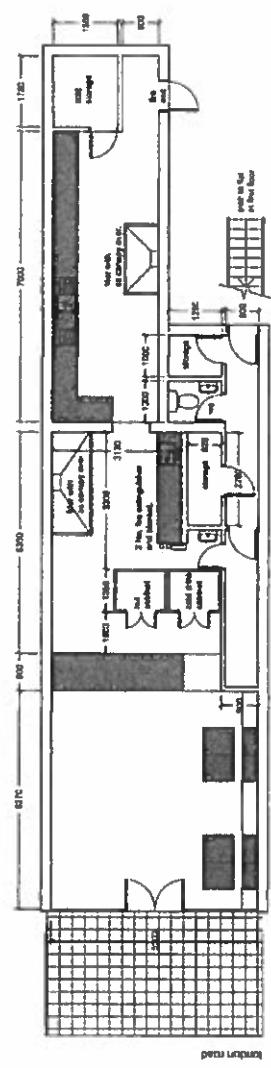

Dear Cllr Mansell,

I have received your note regarding the licensing application made by Perfect Friend Chicken, 1369 London Road, to extend hours beyond normal opening hours.

My comments are the following – in agreement to your objection:

- The extended hours will cause public nuisance to neighbouring properties.
- The extended hours will cause extra littering and gathering of people within Sherlock Close which in turn will pose a safety concern to the residents.
- ASB has been reported a number of times within the Close and extending the hours of the business will not help tackling this issue. I have personally witnessed people urinating in the Close and I have often felt scared to walk through it to get home.

Cllr Mansell, let me give you a quick rundown of the many issues we have experienced in the last year within Sherlock Close. These issues will surely increase in case extended business hours are granted to the chicken shop.

Attached is the response from MP Steve Reed to a complaint I wrote to him a while ago. There is a constant problem with rubbish/littering coming from the flats and the shops ([REDACTED], 1369 London Road) and with fly tipping. NSO [REDACTED] has been investigating the problem and spoke to my neighbour from [REDACTED] Sherlock Close saying they would have issued a fine to the shop on 1369 London Rd because of not disposing of their rubbish correctly. I have often seen tins of oil left on the close. Surely that is not how frying oil should be disposed of – abandoning it on the street!

The close is littered with cardboard containers used for fried chicken and chips. People buy food and drinks from the shop, come to the Close to eat it because it's secluded and leave everything on the ground. I have spoken to some of these people and their reply was: "you pay council tax right? The council will come clean it". Well the council doesn't come to clean and frankly such a reply is simply appalling!!

The lighting in the Close is very dim and this poses a safety concern when coming back at night on foot because there are groups of drinkers that congregate in the area – as the attached letter confirms too. Again the council won't do anything about it (i.e. provide more lighting or other measures).

We are hoping CCTV will be installed and hope to see an improvement as a consequence.

I think granting longer opening hours to the shop is a terrible idea. There would be more rubbish, more noise, more ASB etc. etc. Aren't there enough food and drink businesses within a very short stretch???

Please do reach out to me if you need any further supporting documentation on the issues highlighted as I have plenty of emails and photos.

The council confirms that, they have investigated a number of environmental complaints in regards to this address. I have been told that the council's \* Neighbourhood Safety Team have engaged with shop owners at [REDACTED] London Rd, who have in turn evidenced their waste disposal contract with the Council. As well as this, the occupants of the upstairs flats have been served with enforcement letters highlighting the appropriate way of disposing of their waste.

The council states that there is a persistent problem with street drinkers who congregate in this area late at night. Subsequently the council have suggested a few deterrents. The council have approached the local policing unit and they are also exploring whether they can install surveillance cameras as an additional deterrent to help deter both littering and fly tipping at this location.

I hope that this is a welcome response form the council.

Thank you for your email highlighting the concerns of your constituent [REDACTED]

The Neighbourhood Safety Team have investigated a number of environmental complaints in regards to this address. All efforts they made in the past to put a stop to this unacceptable behaviour from members of the public dumping their rubbish on this close have not provided successful in some cases.

The Neighbourhood Safety Team have engaged with shop owners at [REDACTED] London Rd, who have in turn evidenced their waste disposal contract with the Council. As well as this, the occupants of the upstairs flats have been served with enforcement letters highlighting the appropriate way of disposing of their waste.

Unfortunately, there is a persistent problems with street drinkers who congregate in this area late at night. The local policing unit (formerly PCSOs) have been approached with the hope of alternating their patrols of this area in order to act as a deterrent to this group. in conjunction with this the team are also exploring whether we can install surveillance cameras at this location as an additional deterrent to help deter both littering and fly tipping at this location

I wish to object to this application. This relates to 1369 London Road,

There is no need for late night food. This is close to residential roads and flats over shops on the London Road. The nuisance of car doors slamming is not conducive to a good nights' sleep.

There is already nuisance activity in Sherlock Mews behind this premises. This consists of youths gathering, drinking from cans, smoking who knows what, selling drugs. Ask the SNT. Neighbours do not need the disturbance of these behaviours later into the small hours. Experience of other late night venues is that neighbours are disturbed by car doors slamming late into the night. the only parking is in the street, Tylecroft Road. That is public nuisance.
