a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

There will be a strong management and security procedures will be put in place which encompass the four licensing objectives as below.

Right of admission will be reserved.

Staff will be trained as appropriate in respect of relevant licensing law, the implementation of licence conditions, health safety, first aid, alcohol and drug awareness and conflict management.

Customers will not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises, as defined in the plan submitted with the operating schedule and approved by the Licensing Authority.

A summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Notices will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises, which clearly state the premises policy on admission.

The applicants will ensure that the premises are responsibly managed and supervised at all times to ensure that appropriate steps are taken to promote the four licensing objectives.

It is considered that the open nature of the customer seating areas, the position of the bar/service counter and the provision of staff service allows good viewing coverage of these areas and means good observation and control can be maintained of all activities in the areas where licensable activities will take place.

Additionally, the premises operate an environment where alcohol is served consumed with food in a 'non-confrontational' atmosphere, which should all go to ensuring the Licensees ability to promote the licensing objectives.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

In line with our Alcohol and Social Responsibility Policy there will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption.

Incidents will be logged and recorded in a log book.

Known troublemakers will be barred.

A burglar alarm will be installed.

Toilets will be checked an average of 2 hourly daily and a log kept of the times/dates they are visited.

The premises will operate the current local authority or similar 'proof of age' scheme and display the relevant literature.

The premises will not allow entry to the premises one hour before the end of licensable activities.

Closed Circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

The medium upon which images are recorded, will be clearly identifiable, stored securely, retained for a period of not less than 31 days and be made available to Council and Police Officers on request.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and their staff will at all times remain aware of their responsibilities for the prevention of crime and disorder on the premises and demonstrate a responsible attitude to the marketing and sale of alcohol.

The degree of staff supervision and control as mentioned in (a) above and the provision of a 'winding down' period between the end of any regulated entertainment and the premises closing should go to ensuring that 'prevention of crime and disorder' objective is promoted.

c) Public safety

We already understand our obligations under existing Health and Safety legislation take our responsibilities seriously and have extensive policies in place to meet these obligations.

A fire detection and warning system will be in place along with fire extinguishers.

An emergency lighting system will be in place.

Safety signs and notices will be in place.

Floor staff will conduct physical sweeps inside the premises to remove hazardous objects/waste.

As part of these arrangements the Designated Premises Supervisor and Personal Licence Holders will be aware of their responsibilities to themselves, their staff and customers in respect of public safety and will continue to take all reasonable steps to ensure the maintenance of all provided fire and other safety arrangements (including evacuation procedures) and equipment in accordance with the requirements of current legislation, including means of escape arrangements, fire extinguishing appliances and fire detection installations, as marked on the plan submitted with this application.

The Designated Premises Supervisor/Personal Licence Holder will ensure that their staff have been made fully aware of and trained in their responsibilities and the public and to the emergency fire plan arrangements, which have been enhanced to include for the provision of regulated entertainment.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Reasonable steps are taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.

Managers will be required to liaise with local neighbours as part of their duties and resolve any reasonable concerns.

Emergency call procedures will be put in place.

Deliveries will be conducted during daytime to control noise nuisance.



Notices will be displayed around the premises asking patrons to leave the premise quietly.

The management and staff are pro-active in informing all customers to leave the premises quietly.

e) The protection of children from harm

We recognise the importance of protecting children from harm and this is supported by:-

- Our commitment to health and safety in the operation and maintenance of the premises.
- Our approach to managing the risk of under-age drinking.

We will at all times observe the law and ensure that alcohol is not served to people who are under 18 years of age. The manager and staff are briefed in the importance of their responsibilities in ensuring customers are over 18.

No adult entertainment (paid for by the company of a nude physical nature) will be permitted at these premises. Any children under 16 will remain the responsibility of the accompanying adult when using the premises (and/or exterior area).

Staff will not be allowed to be in sole supervision of children which remains the responsibility of the accompanying adult at all times.

Admittance will be refused to under 16's unless accompanied by an adult.




