The 2007 Direction requires the transferring authority to ensure the contract provides secure pension protection for each member of staff which must be the same as, broadly comparable, or better than, those they had a right to acquire prior to the transfer and on terms which can be enforced by the transferring employee.

- 3.2 At the date of drafting this report there is one contract in the pipeline for Admission Agreements, the procurement of the Payroll Administration and Management Services due to take effect from the 1 April 2015,
