- 2.4 At the Scrutiny Workshop of 22 May 2013, Members considered the implications of the Francis Inquiry report and the Winterbourne inquiry. There was also discussion of the Rochdale and Oxford child grooming cases. This discussion touched on the failure of Staffordshire County Council's Scrutiny Committee to challenge Mid-Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust regarding the quality of its services. It was observed that relying solely on the reassurance of officers under scrutiny without having recourse to independent sources of information was not good practice.
