CORPORATE PRIORITY/POLICY CONTEXT:

This report is in line with objectives to improve safety and minimise accidents (whilst complying with the Councils Conservation Policy) on the Borough's roads as detailed in the Croydon Corporate Plan 2013 – 15

Improving street lighting supports Croydon Council's corporate priorities of improving the environment and reducing crime

AMBITIOUS FOR CROYDON & WHY ARE WE DOING THIS:

Consultation with residents for agreement of selection of Heritage (Urban / Suburban) Style Street Lighting in the Chatsworth Road, East India Estate, Harold Road, Norbury Estate, Norwood Grove, South Norwood & Upper Norwood Triangle, Street Lighting Conservation Area so that an agreed and correct pallet of materials installed.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: These proposals can be contained within available budget.

KEY DECISION REFERENCE NO.: This is not a Key Decision.

1. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1.1 That the Traffic Management Advisory Committee recommend to the Cabinet Member for Transport and Environment to consider the responses to the resident consultation exercise carried from 27th October 2014 and consider whether to approve the chosen style of heritage street lighting equipment (Type A, Ely Lantern with Cardiff Column) to be used in the Chatsworth Road, East India Estate, Harold Road, Norbury Estate, Norwood Grove (excluding Copgate Path), South Norwood & Upper Norwood Triangle (excluding St Aubyn's Rd) Conservation Areas

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2.1 This report seeks agreement to implement the street lighting replacement using the Type A, Ely Lantern with Cardiff Column, in the Chatsworth Road, Harold Road, East India Estate, Norbury Estate, Norwood Grove (excluding Copgate Path), South Norwood & Upper Norwood Triangle (excluding St Aubyn's Rd) Conservation Areas, based on the notification exercise carried out week commencing 27th October 2014.

Skanska (the Council's Street Lighting Service Provider) has carried out a consultation exercise with residents in the associated streets on the chosen style (as determined by the Councils Planning Department) of heritage, street lighting equipment. The Type A, Ely Lantern with Cardiff Column as depicted in Appendix 1 is the only equipment deemed suitable for these Conservation Areas.

2.2 It's worth noting that it is the wish to retain the existing Oak Columns, located around Woodcote Village Green.

3. DETAIL

- **3.1** In August 2011, the Council, in conjunction with Skanska UK PLC commenced a 5 year Core Investment Programme to replace the life expired street lighting stock in Croydon.
- **3.2** The council adopts a strategic approach to the protection of its heritage assets in line with current legislation, guidance from English Heritage and best practice. The council also adopts a pro-active approach through its Local Plan in assessing borough character and interpreting local distinctiveness that underlies the 16 places of Croydon. The 16 Places of Croydon were developed as a part of the Core Strategy (Croydon Local Plan) and based on a detailed analysis of local and residential character of the borough, this underwent extensive statutory public consultation during the period 2009-2012. With regard to local character and historic assets, the council carried out a Conservation Area review in 2007-8 which underwent an extensive consultation process involving local residents associations leading to the designation of nine new conservation areas.
- **3.3** The council is applying a consistent approach to functional lighting which delivers value for money across the borough. The street lighting Private Finance Initiative (PFI) is primarily a project that seeks to provide improvement in technical performance of both light distribution and energy performance of the council's street lighting stock. The government funding criteria is solely concerned with lighting performance as designated by EU standards. Providing for the aesthetic aspects of street lighting columns and luminaires is not a primary objective of the PFI. It does not seek to replicate the infinite variety of styles, ages and performance that is exhibited by its current street lighting provision across the borough and there is no mechanism whereby individuals may formally request that the replacement of existing lighting fixtures does not take place. It is important to understand that the existing street lighting stock is

old and in the majority of cases is approaching the end of its life, this is the main reason the council embarked on a borough wide replacement programme.

- **3.4** Some limited scope does exist within the street lighting PFI to accommodate variation in response to local character, if and where it has been identified as either an historic asset or an area where an uplift in specification is considered appropriate and necessary. To this end the council has identified areas where a permitted variation from the street lighting PFI standard specification is to be accommodated. These are within Croydon Metropolitan Centre designated district centres and statutory conservation areas (adjusted to preclude anomalous situations arising such as different street lights on each side of the road and isolated areas).
- **3.5** In Croydon, the Street Lighting Conservation Areas are split into 4 distinct categories:
 - Village
 - Heritage Croydon Old Town
 - Heritage Victorian
 - Urban/Suburban

Chatsworth Road, Harold Road, East India Estate, Norbury Estate, Norwood Grove (excluding Copgate Path), South Norwood & Upper Norwood Triangle (excluding St Aubyn's Rd) Conservation Areas, fall within the Urban/Suburban category and as such residents have been informed of the choice of equipment deemed suitable by the Croydon Planning Team (Type A, Ely Lantern with Cardiff Column) as detailed in Appendix 1.

3.6 For details of the streets within the Street Lighting Conservation Areas please see Appendix 2.

4. CONSULTATION

4.1 During the week commencing 27th October 2014, a consultation process was carried out by Skanska, whereby 8,773 letters were sent out to residents. Only 2 comments were received and are as laid out in the table below.

4.2 Harold Road : As part of the PFI Contract the decision was made to replace all old street lighting assets due to its age and structural condition. The only columns that have been identified to remain are any columns that have been installed in the last 10 years which forms part of the Deemed to Comply list within the contract.

Chevening Road : As part of the agreed PFI Contract the agreed colour for the street lighting columns is RAL 904 Black.

4.3 It should be noted that there is an option to utilise Swan Neck brackets on this type of arrangement, where this is more in keeping within streets such as Westow Street and Westow Hill.

5 FINANCIAL AND RISK ASSESSMENT CONSIDERATIONS

5.1 There are no adverse financial implications here as the cost of the renewal of equipment and ongoing maintenance is included as part of the PFI arrangement.

12. OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED


