- **ARCH (Association of Retained Council Housing)**

For those who donot know, ARCH (Association of Retained Council Housing) is an association of councils in England who have retained ownership and management of their council homes.

ARCH :

- Aims to get the best deal for councils and their tenants.
- Represents collective interests of retained stock councils
- Lobbies government for a strong retained stock sector
- Demonstrates the benefits of retained stock in meeting wider local and national priorities
- Promotes best practice
- Listens to the views of tenants

With the arrival of the General Election and the period of purdah(*the period leading up to an election, during which government departments generally refrain from making any new announcements*) there's not been much in terms of government policy discussion. Hopefully, fruitful & beneficial discussions can commence with the new government.
