# Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing

- **HWB Members workshop** – Children's Mental Health – developing the priorities for the Local Transformation plan
- **Local Transformation Plan** – engagement, supporting schools and colleges; clinical pathways and strategic join-up
- **Croydon Trailblazer project** – promoting inclusion and emotional resilience; reducing serious youth violence. Mental Health support teams in 19 primary schools, 8 secondary schools, 7 special schools and one college.



# Healthy Weight

- Active Healthy Weight Steering Group
- All-ages Healthy Weight Action plan
- December 2019 Healthy Weight workshop to launch all age action plan – over 70 attendees, range of presentations including from people with lived experience
- Croydon ranked second in London for making progress towards tackling food poverty
