

Publicity in connection with key decisions – Special urgency

The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 ("The regulations")

When twenty-eight clear days' notice cannot be given of the intention to take a decision which meets the Council Constitution definition of a Key Decision, the Proper Officer is required to given notice in writing to the Chair of Overview and Scrutiny or, if there is no such person, each member of the relevant overview and scrutiny committee, of the matter about which the decision is to be made.

In accordance with Regulation 11(1)(a), notice is hereby given that the following key decision is intended to be taken on behalf of the London Borough of Croydon by Leader of the Council, Cabinet on or after 25 November 2020

This decision cannot reasonably be deferred because the results of the Strategic review need to be reported as a matter of urgency to limit the Council's cost exposure. When commissioned at the September Cabinet, it was always the intention to report to the November Cabinet, but no separate listing was made in the forward plan. If the report is not considered at this meeting, the Council will not be able to take appropriate action in regard to its associated companies and other entities where necessary.
