



## Publicity in connection with key decisions – Special urgency

The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 (“The regulations”)

When twenty-eight clear days’ notice cannot be given of the intention to take a decision which meets the Council Constitution definition of a Key Decision, the Proper Officer is required to give notice in writing to the Chair of Overview and Scrutiny or, if there is no such person, each member of the relevant overview and scrutiny committee, of the matter about which the decision is to be made. When only less than five clear working days can be given, the Chair of Scrutiny & Overview needs to grant permission through the use of Special Urgency, that the decision can still be made.

In accordance with Regulation 11(1)(a), notice is hereby given that the following key decision is intended to be taken on behalf of the London Borough of Croydon by the Corporate Director of Sustainable Communities, Regeneration & Economic Recovery on or after the 19<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

This decision cannot reasonably be deferred because:

Delaying this decision will impact on start of planned statutory consultation process for actions arising from the Parking Policy, and will impact the delivery of the transformation project.

This decision is urgent as the Parking Policy needs to be adopted ahead of the publishing of papers for the Cabinet meeting on 27 March 2024. At the 27<sup>th</sup> March meeting, Cabinet will consider the first of the actions arising from the policy, and it necessary for the policy to be adopted before decisions on actions are taken.

The Parking Policy Transformation project is a key deliverable in the council's Exit Strategy.

Important: The Chair of Scrutiny & Overview has consulted with Officers and approved the use of Special Urgency for this decision, as of 19th March 2024. A waiver from call-in has also been agreed for this decision.
