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LICENSING OBJECTIVES

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

- 1. Liaise with the Responsible Authorities to take necessary steps in implementing recommended measures to assist in prevention of crime and disorder:
- 2. Strong management controls and regular staff training to make them aware of the licensing requirements and to meet the four licensing objectives;
- 3. Carry out risk assessments in all areas and make appropriate changes where necessary in view of the licensing requirements;
- 4. Review and implementation of Fire safety, Health & safety procedures and Security System;
- 5. Comprehensive CCTV system to be operated in accordance with the licensing requirements;
- 6. Alcohol to be served staff members to persons seated at the tables only and no drunk or disorderly behaviour will be tolerated;
- 7. The Premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy with appropriate age verification system in place so no selling of alcohol takes place to underage persons;
- 8. All refusals of sale and admission/ ejection from the premises will be recorded appropriately;
- 9. All records required to be kept by law will be made available to Responsible Authorities on request. Written training records will also be kept.
- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 1. A comprehensive CCTV system shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the licensing requirements. All recordings will be date and time stamped and will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available to the Responsible Authorities at their request;
- 2. The CCTV system should cover all entry points to the premises and should enable easy identification of a person entering the premises;
- 3. Alcohol to be served by staff members to persons seated at the tables only;
- 4. Records of all refusals of sale and admission/ rejections/ ejection from premises will be maintained and kept for a period of 12 months and will be made available to the Responsible Authorities at their request;
- 5. A Zero Tolerance Policy towards use, possession and supply of illegal drugs will be adopted and enforced;
- 6. Any violent behaviour or illegal sale or use of drugs will be reported to the police immediately.
- c) Public safety
- 1. Fire risk assessment will be conducted and regularly reviewed;
- 2. Provide appropriate training to all staff members in Health & Safety and adequate and suitable first aid boxes will be maintained;
- 3. Insure the premises adequately for public liability and have a working alarm system.
- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 1. Routine cleaning will be undertaken to the external frontage of the premises to ensure it is kept clean at all times and customers will be encouraged to dispose of their litter appropriately;
- 2. We shall ensure noise does not cause unreasonable disturbance to public and signage asking customers to leave the area quietly and respect the neighborhood.
- e) The protection of children from harm
- 1. Implementation of Challenge 25 policy will ensure that no selling of alcohol takes place to underage persons. Any person

that seems to be under 25 will be required to prove their age as staff will be trained on all aspects of the licensing requirements, particularly on age verification system and record keeping. Staff will be trained to accept only the approved means of ID as proof of a person's age;

2. A register of refusals will be maintained at the premises and will be produced to the police or any other responsible authority upon their request.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK (please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy).
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
 holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their
 stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
 indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
 the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
 Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

Dear Croydon Council,

We are writing to object to the licensing application at the above address.

Whilst we would like to encourage the presence of a diverse range of restaurants in the south croydon area, we are concerned that regard will not be taken of the residential units above the shops on the high street.

The application for late night refreshments is concerning in general due to the risk of visitors leaving the restaurant at late hours during week nights and being noisy There have also been instances where excessively loud music has been played after socialable hours. We are concerned that this will escalate to a more frequent occurrence.

Whilst we are unsure of the permitted hours of operation in planning terms, we would still like the owners and the council to consider restricting the service of alcohol and late night refreshments not past the hours of 10:00pm/10:30pm on weekdays (Mon-Fri) and Sundays to act as a deterrent from anti-social behaviour and similar to other restaurants nearby.

This would help to ensure that residents adjoining and close by benifit from the enjoy of their own property as we do have a right to the little peace we can retain on a highly active high street.

In summary we would like to object and the council to careful consider the context and character of the surrounding area. We would there to be no service of late night refreshments and alcohol past the hours of 10pm -10.30pm similar to the other restaurants.


