Four boroughs

Formed in 2003

- c. 1 million residents c. 400,000 households Voluntary partnership bound by legally-binding Inter Authority Agreements
- Enables authorities to pool their resources, finances and expertise to find better and more cost-effective solutions
- Governance: Joint Committee (Members) and Joint Waste Officer Board (Officers)



Croydon context


- Waste collection and street cleansing are statutory, universal services costs Croydon c.£13.5m pa.
- Croydon is the largest London borough
- In one month, Veolia carryout c.1.4m collections
- Of these c.3.7k are communal collection points
- Communal collections make up c.3% of the total service provided but impact nearly c.20% of our residents.
- Small contract monitoring team serving the borough






Waste Collection Performance

- Contractor is measure on missed collections per 100k
- Repeat missed collections
- Rectifying missed collections
- Monthly performance report generated
- Difficult to filter HRA-specific data.











Street cleansing Performance

- Output / not frequency based
- Streets to be maintained to a Grade B
- Contractors is measure on streets below grade
- Monthly performance report generated
- Difficult to filter HRA-specific data.

Street Cleansing – Code of Practice

Grade	Level of Cleanliness - Litter	Level of Cleanliness – (Detritus dirt and grit, which gives a place for weeds to grow)
Grade A	No litter or refuse.	No detritus
Grade B	Area predominantly free from litter and/or refuse apart from some small items such as cigarette ends, ring pulls etc.	Predominantly free of detritus except for some light scattering
Grade C	Widespread distribution of litter and/or refuse with minor accumulations of small items as Grade B and larger items including beverage containers, fast food packs, animal faeces etc.	accumulations.
Grade D	Area heavily littered by litter and/or refuse with small and large items with significant accumulations along boundaries.	Heavily affected by detritus with significant accumulations

Reporting waste collection issues

- Anyone can report a missed collection up to 48 hours after a missed collection day.
- Missed bins and other collection servicerelated issues can be reported via the councils website
- Systems are fully integrated with the contractor.
