




Funding Per Head (London)

Children's Improvement Plan

Status of the plan

- Improvement plan agreed at cabinet on 20th November
- Plan submitted to Ofsted and the Secretary of State on 8th December
- All prior plans (e.g. JTAI and transitional action plans) have been shut down
- Hard copies of the plan distributed to staff across the service

Progress on delivering the plan and driving improvement:

- Three new teams added in care planning service and redeployment of one team into the assessment service to help reduce workloads
- 22 temporary business support posts added to reduce admin burden
- Three new Heads of Service appointed
- £2.9m committed to fund a range of improvement measures this year
- New social work practice model agreed and roll out plan developed
- Young people engaged in improvement planning as part of 'Takeover day'
- Regular staff engagement forums set up and plan informed by staff feedback
- Recruitment campaign kicked off with dedicated microsite and jobs fair
- Developed new quality assurance framework
- Lead Member and Executive Director visiting good and improving LA's
