our sole priority especially in late-night service.

Let me describe our location, We are located in between "Mill lane" and "Limes Avenue" it mean on our both sides, and at the front is Main Road purely way and at the back is only Back car park for our shop and houses for Limes Avenue located far behind. So we only have three neighbors who live above our business, one of them is exactly above our shop and the other two are above our next door neighbor shop. Firstly we dont have music or other tools involved to make noise, only our indoor compliances are running which don't produces load noise so that can disturbs our neighbors.

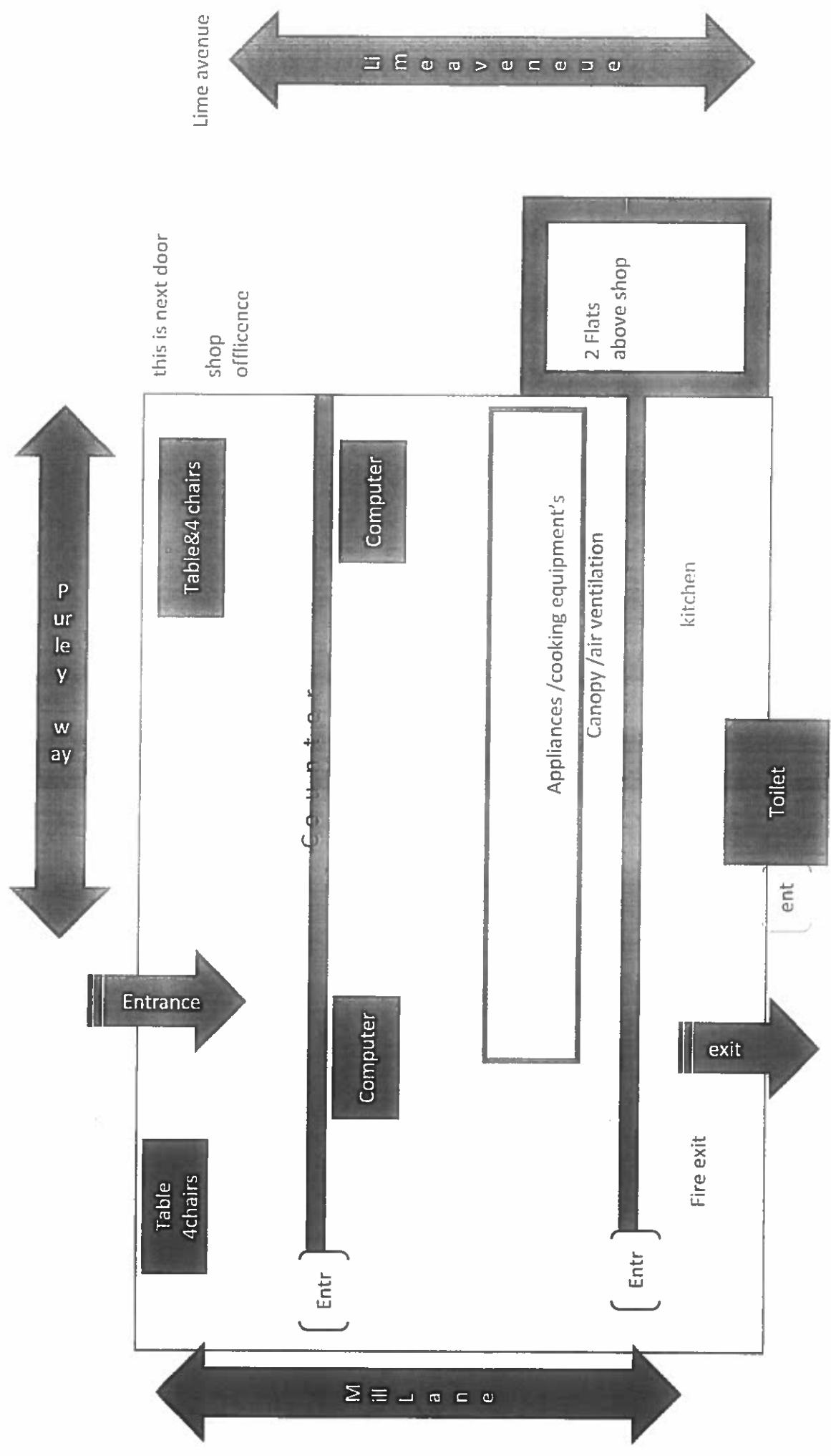

Good afternoon,

I would like to object to the premises license that has been applied for at 352 Purley Way, Croydon, CR0 4NY.

I am the freeholder of the [REDACTED] properties, nos [REDACTED], Purley Way.

My tenants both residential and commercial are frequently complaining about the late night activities of the take away shop known as La Pizzeria, the residential tenants are often disturbed by the noise created by the delivery drivers who congregate at the rear of the premises which is also the [REDACTED] to the flat's who's bedrooms [REDACTED] the service road.

I believe in the past there has been a disturbance to which the police were called when vehicles were damaged after a fight ensued.

Allowing the take way to trade until 1am-3am and possibly 4am in this residential area will cause a public nuisance, 352 is sited on a Red Route and a set of traffic lights so customers and delivery drivers have to use the residential side roads and service road which causes a disturbance to people who are trying to sleep, one of my tenants has a small child who is often disturbed by the noise of car doors slamming, car radios blaring, and general loud chatter and high spirits.

The premises is situated on a secondary parade and is not very well policed meaning that any rowdy behaviour is not dealt with swiftly this can be very intimidating for my tenants who may be arriving or leaving home in the darkness or indeed closing their shop.

I would like to object most strongly to the extended opening hours that are being applied for on the grounds of safety, nuisance and disorder.

Dear Sir,

May I object to the granting of a Late Night Refreshment Licence at 352 Purley Way CR0 4NY.

These premises are on a major road and the customers park in the residential side roads in order to visit the premises. After 11pm the constant opening and closing of car doors to visit the premises, or the coming and going of their delivery vehicles is unacceptable and a public nuisance.

I fear the general noise from the shop in trading after 11pm will be detrimental to the well being of adults and children trying to sleep in houses / flats adjacent to the premises, the noise would no doubt increase if some of the customers were rowdy and there would be public safety, crime and disorder issues.

This area is not the town centre which is well policed, it is a suburban area which is quite at night.
It is reasonable for the take-away / cafe to trade, but it is also reasonable for the residents not to be disturbed late at night or in the early hours of the morning.

I would strongly like to object this application place by La Pizzeria to extend the opening time because they cause disruption even day time yet alone late night time! My landlord told me that someone from your team have visited the locatiom of La Pizzeria so i assume you know what i am talking about! I have a few points hence the reason i want to object.

1. The comunal area is packed with their cars despite not being a parking area.
2. They make allot of noise night time and day time while going out to make a delivery(talking laud on the phone,car doors slaming)!
- 3.They block the residents cars in so they are not able to get out and everytime we ask them to move their cars so we can drive out as most of us we are heading to work they say 5 minutes wich transformes in 30 min.!
- 4 They are rude and threatening ex: next to the La Pizzeria there is a convienece store and one day the "shop man" delivered goods to the store when one of the La Pizzeria workers wanted to drive in and a arguement just started with "the shop man" on wich he threatened by saying "you want me to bring someone and fuck your car up"!
- 5 My 7 years daughter was playing [REDACTED] when a delivery driver wile reversing out he didn't looked in his wing mirrors and almost drived over her lucky us that i am a hgv driver and i have been aware of his intention.

I might have missed other things but i think this should be enough.

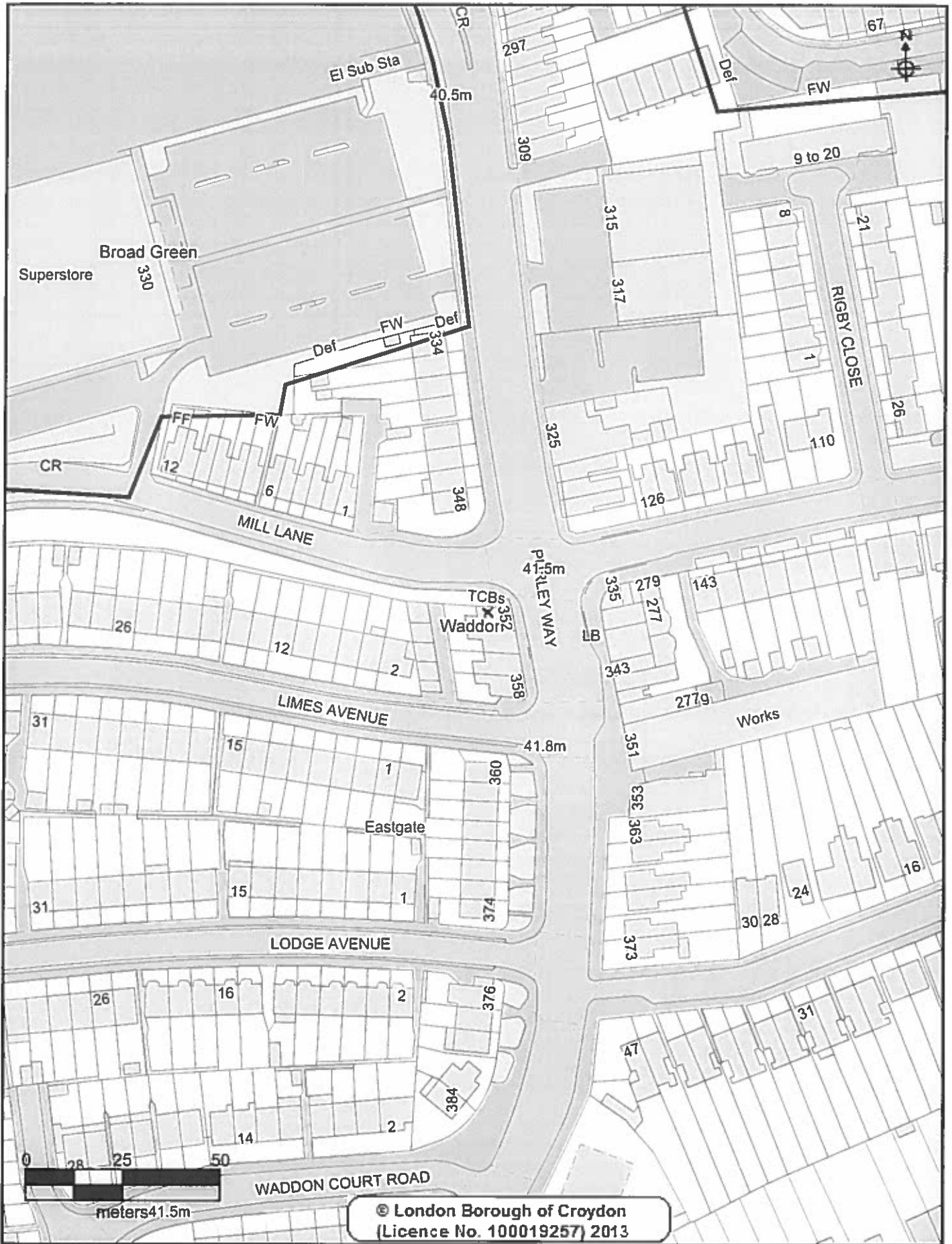
